A Few Words from the Pastor:

Palm Sunday – Our Lenten journey is moving toward its climax. Next Sunday we will witness Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, and will acclaim him king as we carry branches of palm. We continue our focus on Calvary, where our freedom from sin is achieved by the death of Christ. We keep our attention fixed on Him, and His self-emptying love for us.

This Most Sacred Time – We have reached the highpoint of the Church Year, as next Sunday we will enter Holy Week. Plan now to participate fully in this paschal Mystery, as we will begin the Triduum on Wednesday, April 12, with the ancient observance of Tenebrae, which will be followed by our Solemn Liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil.

Tenebrae – Please join us for the prayerful observance of "Tenebrae" this Holy Week. The word itself is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness." It is a Christian religious service celebrated in Holy Week within Western Christianity. The service is unique among our religious practices, because of its focus upon the gradual darkening of the church. Candles are extinguished, one by one, while a series of readings and psalms are chanted or recited. The church is left in only the darkest of shadows. It is meant to capture the looming darkness which comes upon the world at the death of Christ. **We will be celebrating Tenebrae here at St. John's on Wednesday evening of Holy Week, with Mass at 7:00PM and Tenebrae at 7:45PM.**

The Season of Sacramental Life is Upon Us – With the Easter Season just around the corner, we celebrate the glorious life of Christ and his Church, particularly as the sacramental life of God's people comes to the fore. On Wednesday, April 19th, our high school juniors will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation through the ministry of Bishop Mark, and in fellowship with young people from the other city parishes. Our First Communion will be celebrated here at St. John's on April 30th and our annual Mass of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated on Sunday, May 7th.

OUR PARISH FAMILY... Ray & Sue Kennedy were converts to Catholicism about 5 years ago and just joined our parish last summer. Their grandchildren pictured here, Brennan (age 15) and Ryleigh (age 13) live with them and also attend St John's. Ray & Sue were neighbors here in Altoona as children, and celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary this past December. They have 3 adult daughters and a total of 11 grandchildren. Their household is very busy, as in addition to Brennan & Ryleigh, their youngest daughter and her 2 children and also Sue's mother currently live with them. Ray is the Director of Transportation for Amtran, and Sue works part-time as a CNA at a local nursing home and also babysits. They usually attend the 11:00 Mass, and Ray attends Adult Ed while Brennan & Ryleigh attend their Religious Ed classes. Sue said they appreciate the friendly people and "like just about everything" here at St John's.

Remember your Rice Bowls – Throughout the Lenten Season, families have been participating in Operation Rice Bowl as a way of supporting our sister parish in Haiti. Thank you for your kindness, and we ask that these rice bowls be returned to the church at your earliest convenience. I know how much the people of Haiti appreciate what we do for them!

The Blessing of Easter Baskets: A Cherished Catholic Easter Tradition - The blessing of the Easter Basket has been a cherished Catholic ritual for centuries among families of Eastern European origin and adopted by people of all ethnic backgrounds who enjoy this richly symbolic custom. Traditional foods to be included in the basket are lamb or ham, kielbasa, boiled eggs (dyed or plain) Pascha (a special Easter bread), butter, cheese, salt. Often a candle is included to be lit during the blessing at church. After Easter Sunday's Resurrection Mass, the family and guests would share this blessed fare and exchange good wishes. Our Easter Basket Blessing here at St. John's will take place on Holy Saturday at noon. Please come and bring your baskets of food!

Sight and Sound – We are planning a day trip to Sight and Sound in Lancaster to see their terrific production of "Jonah" on Friday, May 19th. The trip would include travel, ticket and dinner. We will be leaving from the parish parking lot mid-morning, and returning in the evening. The cost per person will be \$125. Don't miss this wonderful spring get-away! There is a sign-up sheet on the kiosk in the gathering space or you can call the office to make reservations.

Catholicism – During the season of Lent, on Tuesday evenings, I will be conducting the Catholicism Series at Our Lady of Lourdes, from 6:00 – 7:30PM. It will be held in the parish hall, and all are most welcome. This series features Bishop Robert Barron, our country's most noted Catholic teacher.
