

Saints of the Week -- on Monday of this week we celebrate the feast of the apostle Saint Bartholomew, also known as Nathaniel. On Thursday and Friday we celebrate the lives of a mother and son, Saint Monica and Saint Augustine. Monica prayed for years that her wayward son would find his way to Christ, which he did. Augustine would go on to become one of the most influential theologians in the history of Christianity, whose most famous works are "The City of God" and his "Confessions." Mothers who pray for their wayward children turn to Monica for comfort and strength.

**Haiti Scarf Project:** We have the hope of starting a sewing enterprise for women in Marmount. It will begin small with scarves because they are popular, light weight, and do not need to be sized. The materials with American style ideas will be delivered to Sts. Peter and Paul on our trip in January. Then we will teach the women to sew these scarves, have them returned to us, and sell them here.

Our materials are obtained in the cheapest ways possible: clearances, coupons, yard sales, Goodwill, donations, etc. We are recycling and upcycling (taking old and refashioning).

DURING AUGUST, we will have a display and preview sale of some scarves we have put together. This is to raise some money but more importantly to test the market for what is popular so we know where to go from here. Later, we will have a list requesting items we will need, especially from your "stash".
