

A Few Words from the Dastor:

World Day of Prayer, Tuesday, September 1 - The Vatican has announced a World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, which is well in keeping with the most recent encyclical of Pope Francis, Laudato Si'. The prayer day will be celebrated annually on September 1, in line with the Orthodox Church's day for the protection of the environment. Pope Francis writes: The annual World Day of prayer for the Care of Creation offers to individual believers and to the community a precious opportunity to renew our personal participation in this vocation as custodians of creation, raising to God our thanks for the marvelous works that He has entrusted to our care, invoking his help for the protection of creation and his mercy for the sins committed against the world in which we live. The celebration of the Day on the same date as the Orthodox Church will be a valuable opportunity to bear witness to our growing communion with our orthodox brothers and sisters. We live in a time where all Christians are faced with identical and important challenges and we must give common replies to these in order to appear more credible and effective. Therefore it is my hope that this Day can involve, in some way, other Churches and ecclesial Communities and be celebrated in union with the initiatives that the World Council of Churches is promoting on this issue.

Saints of the Week - Many of us older folks remember singing Gregorian Chant at Mass. This melodic chant was in Latin and was meant to capture the sacredness of the Liturgy. This form of music takes its name from Pope Gregory the Great, whose feast we celebrate this Thursday. He is one of the four great Doctors of the Latin Church.

Mass Schedule: The late Sunday morning Mass will return to its usual time on the Sunday AFTER LABOR DAY, September 13.
