A Few Words from the Dastor:

Making the Most of our School Building - As the consolidation of our city Catholic Schools continues, consideration needs to be given to making the best use of our own school building. We have been approached by NHS Schools, a nonprofit system of schools for children with autism, which is interested in leasing our building. Currently located at the old Mt. Carmel School, NHS is seeking a more central location, for it serves multiple school districts in providing specialized education for autistic children. The NHS use of our building, Monday through Friday, will in no way affect our use of this space for our Religious Ed. classes, or for any evening or weekend parish functions in the gym or cafeteria. This lease will be a win-win for all involved. We will gain some needed income for the maintenance of our building, while continuing to have full use of our facilities on evenings and weekends. For NHS, it will be more centrally located to meet the needs of their client school districts, with the bonus of having a gymnasium for the use of the children. There will be a special parish meeting on Wednesday, January 20th at 7:00 in the cafeteria to discuss this possibility. Kelly Brennan, the director of our local NHS school, will be in attendance to answer any questions. Those wishing to have their voice heard are encouraged to attend.

"Christians Uniting": The Ecumenical Conference of Greater Altoona sponsors this weekly program on the Public Access Channel. It airs on Sundays at 12:30PM and 7:30PM. You may enjoy watching it!

Adult Ed to Resume - Our Sunday morning Adult Ed continues, with a focus on St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. This letter of Paul will be read each Sunday up until the beginning of Lent. All are encouraged to bring your bible. All are most welcome!

Praying for Christian Unity - Later this month, from January 18-25, we will be observing the *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*. There has never been a time in our history when Christian need to be united and speaking with one voice, especially in the face of persecutions in the Middle East and in response to the rampant materialism in our own culture. This is an urgent mission for Pope Francis, as it should be for all of us!

Old Palms for Ash Wednesday - Lent begins early this year (February 10th), and since the ashes we use for Ash Wednesday are from the palms of the previous year, we are asking that if you have any old palm in your home from last Palm Sunday, please bring them to church and place it in the basket provided.

Easter Comes Early This Year - The celebration of the Lord's Resurrection comes very early in 2016, on the 27th of March. Easter is a movable feast in the Christian calendar, the date of which was determined by the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD. At this council it was established that Easter would be held on the first Sunday after the first full moon occurring on or after the spring equinox. The Orthodox churches follow the same rule. However, they follow the Julian Calendar and the Western church follows the Gregorian Calendar. This year the Orthodox Easter will be on May 1st.
