A Few Words from the Pastor:

Seeing America First – At our Wednesday evening Mass this week we welcome as our celebrant Father Anthony Petracca. He has recently published a travel book entitled Seeing America First, which includes stories from his own treks across the country, along with recommendations for travel destinations in each of the 50 states! He will be doing a book signing after Mass, as well as offer a brief comment on the travels which prompted his writing. All are encouraged to come to Mass and visit with Father Petracca, and purchase his book!

Speaking of “Seeing America First” – On Sunday afternoon I will leave to take a week in the Florida sun, along with two priest companions. I am grateful for Deacon Gene and our excellent staff for holding down the fort in my absence.

Unbound – Next weekend a visiting priest, Rev. John D. Kirwin, will be here representing “Unbound.” Formerly known as the Christian Foundation for Children and Aging (CFCA), Unbound is a nonprofit sponsorship organization headquartered in Kansas City, Kansas. Unbound was founded by lay Catholic workers acting on the Gospel call to serve the poor. “Unbound” partners with families living in poverty, empowering them to become self-sufficient and fulfill their desired potential. Rather than a special collection, Unbound encourages sponsorships. Our visiting priest will provide materials, and all the necessary information about how YOU can help the disadvantaged!

The Baptism of the Lord – In our liturgical calendar this year, with Christmas on a Sunday, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which is usually celebrated the Sunday after the Epiphany, is transferred to Monday of this week. Please join us for this important feast!

A New Playground and Fence – On Lotz Avenue behind the church, our school tenants, NHS, have erected a fence within which a playground will be constructed. When the weather is suitable, this will give the children a safe place to play. The cost of the fence and playground is met by NHS themselves.

National Migration Week (January 8 – 15) – For nearly a half century, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated National Migration Week, which is an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants, including immigrants, refugees, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking. The theme for National Migration Week 2017 draws attention to Pope Francis' call to create a culture of encounter, and in doing so to look beyond our own needs and wants to those of others around us. In the homily given at his first Pentecost as pope, he emphasized the importance of encounter in the Christian faith: "For me this word is very important. Encounter with others. Why? Because faith is an encounter with Jesus, and we must do what Jesus does: encounter others."

New Sidewalks – Our gratitude to Dave Auerbeck for the new sidewalks that he and his crew poured between our back parking lot and our parish office. We appreciate his generosity and hard work.

Adult Ed to Resume – Our Adult Ed program continues next Sunday, January 8, as we welcome again Bishop Robert Barron, with a new series entitled “Pivotal Players.” This 12 week series will illuminate the contribution of some of Catholicism’s greatest saints, artists and writers. It will include Saint Francis of Assisi (where we will begin) and Saint Catherine of Siena, St. Thomas Aquinas and Blessed John Henry Newman, Michelangelo and G.K. Chesterton. This is a program you will not want to miss!

Praying for Christian Unity – Later this month, from January 18-25, we will be observing the *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*. There has never been a time in our history when Christian need to be united and speaking with one voice, especially in the face of persecutions in the Middle East and in response to the rampant materialism in our own culture. This is an urgent mission for Pope Francis, as it should be for all of us! The theme for this year: *Reconciliation: the Love of Christ Impels Us!*
