A New Bishop for Greensburg– The diocese of Greensburg welcomes Father Edward Malesic as its new bishop on Monday, July 13. Bishop Malesic was a student of mine when I served as Spiritual Director at the Pontifical College Josephinum back in the 1980's. He is an wonderful priest and will be a terrific bishop. We rejoice with our brothers and sisters in our neighboring diocese.

A Priests' Pilgrimage – The diocese is sponsoring a pilgrimage for priests to the Shrine of the North American Martyrs and Saint Kateri Tekakwitha this Wednesday and Thursday, July 15-16. The parishioners of our diocese will be remembered in a concelebrated Mass which we will offer with Bishop Mark.

Saint Junipero Serra- During his visit to the United States in September, Pope Francis will canonize Father Junipero Serra, the 16th century Spanish missionary who came to Mexico in 1749 and was eventually sent to California. Father Serra established his first mission, San Diego, in 1769. He built eight more missions over the next thirteen years: San Carlos Borromeo, San Antonio de Padua, San Gabriel, San Luis Obispo, San Juan Capistrano, Santa Clara, San Francisco, and San Buenaventura. Serra worked tirelessly to maintain the missions and is credited with helping the Spanish establish a presence in California. Serra died in 1784 at Mission San Carlos Borroméo de Carmelo located in present-day Carmel, California.
