A Few Words from the Pastor:

Our Parish Picnic – Many, many thanks to all who helped with our parish picnic last Sunday. It was certainly HOT, but all enjoyed the fellowship which we share as a parish family. May this spirit continue throughout the year! A special thanks to the Social Committee, who did so much to prepare for the day. Legion Park in Hollidaysburg was an excellent location for our picnic! I suspect strongly that it will be our annual destination!

A Time of Transition – As difficult as it was to have our parish school closed, we are confident that the newly formed Holy Trinity School will continue to provide for the children of our parish and city an excellent Catholic Education. We are also grateful that St. Patrick's has been able to continue its educational ministry, providing a PreK-8 model. With children from this parish in both schools, we extend our prayers and support for the new school year, which begins soon and very soon! Virtually all of our teachers were able to find employment in these schools, so our children will find some familiar faces when they arrive!

We Welcome our Tenants! – Our lease with NHS (Northwestern Human Services) begins on August 1. A special welcome to the principal, Kelly Brennan, a life-long resident of Altoona, and niece to Father Clem Gardner and the late Father Daniel O'Friel. I anticipate a good working relationship with Kelly and her faculty and staff! We pray that this association is beneficial to all involved.

Stop By Our New Office – Our new parish office is now located in the former PreK room on the lower level of the church. Stop by for a visit to our business manager/secretary, Mary Ann Mirobelli and our music director/pastoral associate, Debbie Johnson! There is a doorbell that alerts them of your arrival, and you will be "buzzed in," as you were in our previous office.

Saints of the Week: On Monday, the church honors St. Alphonsus Maria de Liguori, who was born of a noble family in Italy in 1696. He received an exceptional education in philosophy, literature, and the arts. At the age of 18 he joined the Confraternity of Our Lady of Mercy with whom he cared for the sick at the hospital for "incurables," washing afflicted bodies, feeding the

helpless, changing bedclothes and devoting himself to works of mercy and compassion. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1726, and caring for the poor, wherever his journey took him, was the hallmark of his calling. He sought others who were called as he was, to care for the least of God's people, and adopted a style of ministry to "mission among the people" — and so began the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, commonly known as the Redemptorists.

The patron of parish priests, St. John Vianney, is honored on August 4. Born in 1786, he would become known as the Cure of Ars, he spent countless hours in the confessional and hundreds of thousands of people would come to the little French village of Ars annually to hear him preach and to go to confession to him.

Finally, Saturday of this week is the Feast of the Transfiguration, when Christ was revealed in glory on Mt. Tabor to Peter, James and John. This feast is included in the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary, which were promoted by Saint John Paul II.

An Annual Class Reunion – This week I am taking a trip to Atlanta to spend time with former classmates. I am grateful, as always, for Deacon Gene and his assistance in my absence!

More on our Mission to Haiti – It became very clear to us on our visit to our sister parish in Haiti that there is a great need for desks for the school children. It is financially unrealistic to pack up our extra desks and send them. However, there is a diocesan-run carpenter shop in the town of Hinche, near to our Sister Parish, which builds desks and pews for parishes in their diocese. We are looking first for donors who might wish to purchase a classroom full of desks: the 1st and 2nd grade classroom is in need of 30 desks, at the cost of \$2,700. The 3rd and 4th grade classroom needs the same number, at the cost of \$2,850. A classroom of even larger desks for the 5th and 6th graders will be \$3,000. Ninety chairs are needed for the pre-school and kindergarten children @ \$2,250, and 9 tables for \$1,710. For the teachers, we need 10 desks and 10 chairs at the cost of \$1,670. The Lord will never be outdone in generosity and any gift of any amount will be most helpful!
