### **A Few Words from the Dastor:**

Our Parish, Thankful, and Looking Forward - There have been many hundreds of Catholic schools across the States which have closed in the past ten years, but it is only when it is our own that we feel the sharp pain of loss. We have had a long and storied tradition of parish-based Catholic education here at St. John's, and there are very strong bonds of affection which we have for our school and our teachers. However, the hard realities of the increasing cost of parish-based parochial schools, as well as a declining population in the Altoona area, have brought us to the painful but necessary consolidation of schools. I am convinced, however, that such a consolidation in the Altoona area is the surest way that quality Catholic education will remains available and affordable. The formation of a middle school for the city, as well as the strengthening of our remaining elementary schools, will continue to provide the highest quality of Catholic education for parents who desire that for their children. We will do our best here at St. John's to make the transitions as smooth as possible. I am reminded of those beautiful words of Dag Hammarskjöld in his book Markings: "For all that is been, Thank You! For all that will be, Yes!"

**God in America** - We continue our Adult Ed presentation on how "religious liberty shaped America." How did Christianity come to our shores? Who were all these different denominations and why were they coming to America? Using as our resource a PBS Frontline documentary, we will be given an interesting and informative history of religion in America. As we draw near to Thanksgiving, this will be most fitting!
