A Few Words from the Pastor:

Conference on the Environment – This Thursday, November 12, at 7:00PM, our parish will host a conference entitled "The Care of our Common Home." Responding to the recent encyclical on Pope Francis on the environment, Bishop Mark Bartchak will give the keynote address, summarizing the focus of the encyclical. Representatives of various faith traditions will then give their response based on their own faith traditions. All are encouraged to join us!

God in America – We continue our Adult Ed presentation on how "religious liberty shaped America." How did Christianity come to our shores? Who were all these different denominations and why were they coming to America? Using as our resource a PBS Frontline documentary, we will be given an interesting and informative history of religion in America. As we draw near to Thanksgiving, this will be most fitting! The Basilica of the Week? – YES! On Monday the Universal Church celebrates the feast of the <u>Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome</u>, the oldest and highest ranking of the four major basilicas in Rome. The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, the official ecclesiastical seat of the Holy Father, the Bishop of Rome, not St. Peter's Basilica as so many mistakenly believe. The Basilica is also called the Church of Holy Savior or the Church of St. John Baptist. In ancient Rome this was the church where everyone was baptized. It the oldest church in the West, built in the time of Constantine and was consecrated by Pope Sylvester in 324.

Preparing for the Year of Mercy – On December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Pope Francis will inaugurate a special Year of Mercy. The logo on the front of the bulletin captures the theme of this year, "Merciful like the Father." A large banner will be placed in the near our sanctuary as a daily reminder of the call to mercy which is given to us. In the Gathering Space we will have a series of banners which will keep us attentive to this theme. There will be a variety of ways that we will be observing this Holy Year in 2016. Stay tuned!

Advent Penance Service – There is no better preparation for Christmas AND for the Year of Mercy than the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance. We have scheduled our Advent Penance Service for Sunday, December 6th at 4:00 PM. PLEASE MARK YOUR CALENDARS!
