

September 9, St. Peter Claver, "Black Lives Matter": After his ordination to the priesthood in 1616, St. Peter Claver dedicated himself by special vow to the service of the African slaves – a work that was to last for thirty-three years. He labored unceasingly for the salvation of the African slaves and the abolition of the slave trade. Boarding the slave ships as they entered the harbor, he would hurry to the hold where the slaves were kept, and offer whatever refreshments he could afford; he would care for the sick and dying, and instruct the slaves with black catechists before administering the Sacraments. Through his efforts three hundred thousand souls entered the Church. Long before it became a movement in our times, Father Peter Claver knew that "Black Lives Matter."

Then we will teach the women to sew these scarves, have them returned to us, and sell them here.

Our materials are obtained in the cheapest ways possible: clearances, coupons, yard sales, Goodwill, donations, etc. We are recycling and upcycling (taking old and refashioning).

DURING AUGUST, we will have a display and preview sale of some scarves we have put together. This is to raise some money but more importantly to test the market for what is popular so we know where to go from here.
