## **March Prayer Intention of Pope Francis**

#### FORMATION OF SPIRITUAL DISCERNMENT

That the Church may appreciate the urgency of formation in spiritual discernment, both on the personal and communitarian levels.



## A Few Words from the Pastor:

**Tenebrae** – Please join us for the prayerful observance of "Tenebrae" this Holy Week. The word itself is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness." The service is unique among our religious practices, because of its focus upon the gradual darkening of the church. Candles are extinguishing, one by one, while a series of readings and psalms are chanted or recited. The church is left in only the darkest of shadows. It is meant to capture the looming darkness which comes upon the world at the death of Christ. We will be celebrating Tenebrae here at St. Johns on Wednesday evening of Holy Week, with Mass at 7:00 followed by Tenebrae.

Holy Thursday Mass and Adoration – the Mass of the Lord's Supper is a beautiful time to renew our love for the Eucharist. Following Mass, there is adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Day Chapel until 10. This time of adoration coincides with the time that Jesus spent in the Garden of Olives after the Last Supper. "Could you not watch with me one hour?"

**Good Friday** – Stations of the Cross will be prayed at noon on Good Friday, with a time of prayer before the cross throughout the day. The Solemn Commemoration of the Passion will be observed at 7:00 on Good Friday evening.

The Blessing of Easter Baskets: A Cherished Catholic Easter Tradition - The blessing of the Easter Basket has been a cherished Catholic ritual for centuries among families of Eastern European origin and adopted by people of all ethnic backgrounds who enjoy this richly symbolic custom. On Holy Saturday, families prepare their Easter Baskets to be later blessed at church. After Easter Sunday's Resurrection Mass, the family and guests would share this blessed fare and exchange good wishes. Our Easter Basket Blessing here at St. John's will take place on Holy Saturday at noon. Please come and bring your baskets!

Liturgical Reflection... Today is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. The Christian world begins its holiest of weeks. Today we enter the sacred city Jerusalem where our Lord is met with shouts of Hosannas, only later to be handed over to crucifixion and death. Lent will end this week before the great Three Days of the Lord's death and resurrection. Can you name what must die in your life so that new life can enter? For forty days we have fasted, prayed, and given alms. We will die with the Lord, only to rise with him. For the living and the dead, these are the days commemorating our salvation in Jesus Christ. Death and resurrection ground our faith. We dare to enter the holy city to die and rise with our Lord.

The Easter Vigil – Considered the "Mother of all Liturgies," our Easter Vigil will be celebrated at 8:30 PM on Saturday, March 31<sup>st</sup>. At this liturgy we will be welcoming Ashley Greslick into full membership in the Catholic Faith, as she will receive the sacrament of Confirmation and will receive the Eucharist for the first time.

**Easter Masses** - The Glories of the risen Christ will be celebrated at our Easter liturgies on Sunday morning at 8 and 11 o'clock. He is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!

**Confessions this week** – I will be available for Confessions this Holy Week on Wednesday at 6:00 PM. Have you made your Lenten confession?

Remember your Rice Bowls – Throughout the Lenten Season families have been participating in Operation Rice Bowl as a way of supporting our sister parish in Haiti. Thank you for your kindness, and we ask that these rice bowls be returned to the church at your earliest convenience. I know how much the people of Haiti appreciate what we do for them!

The Season of Sacramental Life is Upon Us – With the Easter Season just around the corner, we celebrate the glorious life of Christ and his Church, particularly as the sacramental life of God's people comes to the fore. On Tuesday, April 17<sup>th</sup>, our high school juniors will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation through the ministry of Bishop Mark, and in fellowship with young people from the other city parishes. Our annual Mass of the Anointing of the Sick is scheduled for Sunday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> at 2:00 PM, and our First Communion will be celebrated here at St. John's on April 29<sup>th</sup> at the 11:00 Mass.

**Adult Ed** – We will be taking a break from Adult Ed until the Sunday after Easter, when we will continue reflecting on the Encyclical of Pope Francis, "Joy of the Gospel." As always, all are most welcome.






