A Few Words from the Pastor:

Stations of the Cross - We would like to place a greater focus on the Stations of the Cross, a venerated tradition in the Catholic Faith in which we journey with Christ to Calvary. Stations are observed each Friday of Lent at 7:00 PM. Mark your calendar, and plan to walk in the steps of Jesus this Lent.

Some Finishing Touches – With the architectural insights of Rick Karcher, one of the architects who designed our beautiful church, we are making progress in some finishing touches which will highlight the art of Allen Capriotti, as well as accent the sanctuary. Painting has been done by our own Ken Dunmire, with some gold-leaf work to be completed in the very near future. We will now be ready for the lettering which will identify each of the scenes of the gospel of John which surround the church!

Our Church Discovered! — Our heartfelt appreciation to those who participated in "Discovering Our Church" last Saturday evening. Our thanks as well to those who served the salad and pizza afterwards. Events such as these do a lot to nurture parish life!

Adult Ed – For the remaining Sundays of Lent, and into the Easter Season, we will be reflecting upon Pope Francis' Letter "The Joy of the Gospel." This inspiring document challenges every Christian to look more seriously at their vocation to be a "Missionary Disciple."

Of Gods and Men – On Friday, March 9th at 7:30 (following Stations of the Cross), there will be a showing of the film "Of Gods and Men" in the Parish Center. This film is based upon the true life story of Trappist monks in Algeria in the mid-90's, who live in harmony with their Muslim neighbors. An Islamic fundamentalist group creates fear in the village, as the monks struggle with the decision to leave or to stay, come what may. This true story of faith and heroism is a perfect Lenten film, showcasing the depth of Christian faith. These monks have been recommended for canonization by Pope Francis.

Making a Good Confession— When was the last time you went to confession? Consider doing so this Lent, each Wednesday evening at 5:00PM,or on Saturdays at 3:00PM. Ask God for the Holy Spirit's help to examine your conscience well by prayerfully reviewing your conduct in light of the commandments and the example of Christ. Don't let this Lent pass without making a good confession!

Operation Rice Bowl– This Lent we are again participating in Operation Rice Bowl. Your generosity for those most in need is so very much appreciated.

Pastor to All, Billy Graham – One of the great preachers of the twentieth century has been called home to God. The Catholic Bishop's Conference issued these words of tribute: "Headlines today will describe Billy Graham as the preacher to millions and the advisor of presidents but first and foremost, he was a man of deep Christian faith. Committed to the Gospel, his personal witness and preaching of Jesus Christ touched the hearts of Americans spanning many generations. In a particular way, Catholics feel the loss of one of the greatest pastors of our time. His ecumenical approach in ministry helped to forge bonds of friendship and understanding between Catholics and Protestants. He reminded us that what we had in common in Christ was greater than what divided us.

Fasting and Abstinence in Lent - Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Arise! Together in Christ! – Arise Together in Christ is a three-year, parish-centered process of evangelization and spiritual renewal, designed to help people develop a closer relationship with Christ, grow in community, and reach out in service to others. Each parish has been asked to form an "Arise" parish team. Should you be interested in serving on this team, or simply want to learn more about "Arise," please contact Msgr. Becker or Debbie Johnson. Family Ritual

Easter Sunday is a moveable feast based on the moon. It always occurs on the Sunday following a full moon after the Spring Equinox on March 20th. This month we have two full moon dates—March 1st and 31st. As a family, take the time to view the phases of the moon each night when visible.

Notice how the light decreases and increases each night and how the daylight increases each day. Record your findings and discuss them on the eve of Easter, perhaps by campfire or moonlight.



Thank God for creating an amazing universe and for giving us His Son, Jesus, who suffered for our eternal light in heaven.

Spiritual Resolutions

We work on our physical fitness but what about our spiritual fitness?

March: Balance love of others and love of self.



"I do not mean that there should be relief for others and pressure on you, but it is a question of fair balance between your present abundance and their need, so that their abundance may be for your need, in order that there might be a fair balance." 2Cor 8:13-14

Keeping balanced is important in physical exercise. A little too far to one side and a crew loses ground or a runner loses speed. Strike a balance. If you are caring for others and not for yourself, pull back and care for yourself, too. If you are paying excessive attention to your schedule and your needs and not thinking about what others might need, ask them how you might help them.

Give up bad parenting for Lent

No parent is immune from weak parenting moments, and while we shouldn't beat ourselves up about momentary lapses, there are a few things we would all do well to try to give up completely.

- Give up yelling. Yelling escalates an already volatile situation. Parents who often yell in response to misbehaving children may need to develop appropriate consequences to give their children quickly (and quietly).
- Give up comparing. If it's tempting for you to verbally compare your children to each other, keep your comments to yourself. Children who feel in constant competition with each other miss out on much of the joy that comes from a close relationship with siblings.
- ♥ Give up inconsistency. Children will thrive when parents draw boundaries, keep their promises (both for rewards and consequences), and provide a consistent routine to follow.

End your family's day with gratefulness this Lent. While you're tucking your children into bed, ask them to name three things they are grateful for. One of these should be a specific person. Doing this will help your child focus on the goodness around him or her. You and your spouse can do the same thing before bed.

"We started doing this and it's been good for all of us," say Bill, father of four. "Hearing what bubbles to the top of the kids' minds is interesting and sometimes surprising—like when our daughter named her older brother as one of her three. It puts them in a positive frame of mind at bedtime. For my wife and me, the total of six items of gratitude makes us aware of how much we have to be thankful for, even on days when work was annoying and the kids were giving us trouble."


