## 1. Prayer & Opening

#### 4. New Business:

# a) Parish Pastoral Plan

As mentioned in previous meetings, we would like to explore the idea of a pastoral plan. This would involve the council to lay out a plan for what we'd like to accomplish in the years to come. Monsignor and Chris R. worked to prepare a presentation for this meeting. This presentation and discussion was based on the 5 models of the church as laid out by Avery Cardinal Dulles.

Each of these 5 models offers insight to WHO we are as a parish and they each highlight and underscore a vital aspect of the church. After each of the 5 models were explained, the council then broke out in to mini groups to talk about what was covered. The council explored which of the models is most apparent in our parish and which of the models needs the most work in our parish.

In short, these 5 models are described as:

#### Herald

The herald model emphasizes on faith and proclamation over interpersonal relations and mystical communion. The church is a herald – one who receives a message and passes it on. In this model, it is shown that it is the task of the church to proclaim.

#### Mystical Body / Communion

The church consists of people of faith united by their common participation in God's spirit through Christ. It is a communion of people, expressed by external bonds of creed, worship and ecclesiastical fellowship. The strength of this model lies in an emphasis on a shared lift of mutual fellowship in a loving community.

#### Institution

With this model, the church is defined primarily in terms of its visible structures, and especially the rights and powers of its hierarchy. The church government is not a democracy or representative, but hierarchical and consultative. There is order, unity and consistency of teaching throughout the institution.

### Sacrament

In this model, the church is a sacrament; a sign and transmitter of God's presence. The church transmits God's grace within a community. These

sacraments are never individual transaction, but they are to be celebrated within the community.

#### Servant

The servant model shows that the church is part of the total human family; sharing the same concerns as the rest of mankind. We realize that the needs of the world are our needs; this is based on the ministry of Jesus who was a man who served others. The church carries on this mission by seeking to serve the world. The strength of this model lies in an emphasis on serving others, not the church's own self interest.

#### **5.** Committee reports:

Rather than spending a large chunk of parish council meetings reviewing each of the committee reports, this month it was decided to try something different. Each committee liaison was tasked to submit their reports ahead of time. Each council member was then tasked to review these reports before meeting. If any specific questions arise, there was still time to address any during the council meeting. This format seems to be well received, and we will continue with this format.

Mary Lee Davis spoke this weekend after masses. There will be an insert in the bulletin about our student sponsorship campaign.

The veterinarians helped 600 animals, working with a great team of vet techs begun by Dr. Matt Stachmus nine years ago and now well trained by both him and Dr. Shawn Orczeck. Shawn and Matt received donations of 270 New Testaments with Psalms in Creole. They also had more money which was used to purchase 65 bibles in Creole while we were in Port-au-Prince. The amazing part of this is that Ss. Peter and Paul's theme this year is the study of the bible. This was not known by Shawn and Matt. The bibles were just something they had been trying to do.

I had about 80 string bags not yet strung already down there. I was finally able to get the right size string from Ollie's and Fathers Banive and Kenley (assistant) and I finished the project for the students. Some school supplies were given, including flashcards and puzzles in math.

Thanks to Father Kenley's involvement with the school he was able to help me get photos of the 20 poorest students to begin our sponsorship campaign. We need a stable budget for the school.

Upcoming: solar grid contributions and possible visit from Father Banive in April. Next trip will not be until Fall of 2018.
