COMMUNAL PENANCE SERVICE - All are encouraged to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the Lenten Season. Please join us this Sunday at 4:00 PM, when a number of priests will be here at St. John's to assist with individual confessions.

COMMUNION FROM THE CUP - Bishop Mark has directed that parishes may begin distributing Holy Communion under both forms at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023. This permission to resume the practice of offering the Precious Blood will be introduced gradually in such a way that parishioners may come to their own readiness to receive. More instruction on this will be forthcoming in subsequent bulletins.

OUR GRATITUDE - Many thanks to all those who have "taken a step" in their sacred giving to the parish! God is never outdone in generosity. May His blessings be upon you in abundance!

OUR COMMITMENT TO STEWARDSHIP! We might best consider Lent as our "Stewardship Season"! We are grateful to those who have already pledged for the coming year and encourage prayerful reflection on the measure of our giving in return for God's many blessings. Our pledge of prayer, service and sacrificial giving is our commitment to the ways in which we can give ourselves to God's work, commit our lives to God's service, and use our blessings to build up God's kingdom. We have mailed to each household a brightly colored brochure: Sacred Giving in a World of Plenty, which is particularly instructive, as you consider "taking a step" in your commitment to the financial support of our parish. Remember that your giving will not only help St. John's meet its rising operating expenses, but it will do YOU a world of spiritual good!!

Remembering that Jesus fasted in the desert, we are called to imitate him in this sacred season. You are also required to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent. My fasting is closely related to my care for the poor: "when I fast, another person must eat in my place!"

ADULT FAITH FORMATION: We will finish up our series, Forgiven, with a video about the Sacrament of Reconciliation on March 19th, and a video about the Paschal Mystery on March 26th. There will be no class on Palm Sunday or Easter, April 2nd and 9th. We will resume on Sunday, April 16th, and continue to meet through Sunday, May 21st. 



God's Word for Children







Today we hear about David, son of Jesse, who lived in Bethlehem. Even though David was the youngest of all his brothers and a simple shepherd, he was the one God directed Samuel to anoint. God saw greatness in David, who became one of the great kings of Israel. This story reminds us not to judge others by their outward appearance.

Jesus was born in Bethlehem because Joseph and Mary went to "the city of David" for the Roman census, for Joseph was "of the house and family of David."

Like David before him, Jesus would be called Good Shepherd and king. Pontius Pilate even had the sign INRI fastened to Jesus' cross. The letters stand for the Latin words for "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews."

Draw a picture of Jesus as the Good Shepherd next to the sheep. Next to the cross, draw a picture of how Jesus would look as a king. What kind of king would he be?
