A Few Words from the Pastor:

EASTER JOY - We have never needed Easter more than this year, when we are worn down and worn out by a pandemic which has turned our lives upside down and inside out! The promise of the Resurrection is the assurance that God's love, in every circumstance, is victorious, and that a new heaven and a new earth have come down out of heaven from God. We pray that with the eyes of faith we can see in our daily lives the radiant presence of the Redeemer, who in his Resurrection has made all things new!!!

GRATITUDE, GRATITUDE - With thankful hearts we acknowledge the gifts of time, talent and treasure which have been displayed for the parish in this most sacred time. Our music ministry, our church decorators, our liturgical ministries, and the countless parishioners who contributed to the purchase of flowers for the Feast – to you all we owe our love and gratitude.

EASTER SUNDAY -The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes it this way: "Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the 'Feast of feasts', the 'Solemnity of solemnities', just as the Eucharist is the 'Sacrament of sacraments'. St. Athanasius calls Easter 'the Great Sunday' and the Eastern Churches call Holy Week 'the Great Week'. The mystery of the Resurrection, in which Christ crushed death, permeates with its powerful energy our old time, until all is subjected to him."

A PRAYER CANDLE FOR EASTER - We are making available this Easter small votive candles which will remind us during the Easter season of Christ's presence as the Light of the World. They can be a small reminder of the beauty of the Easter candle, and can be placed next to an icon or crucifix. They can be lit at Easter dinner or anytime a person praying privately, aware that it is Christ who is our Light.

"OUR SUNDAY BEST" - This expression has its roots in the way churchgoers prepare themselves to worship Christ the King! We put on our "Sunday best" as a sign of the honor with which we acknowledge Christ the Risen One. We certainly do it for Easter Sunday, when "we come dressed for an audience with the Living God." The Church teaches us that every Sunday is Easter! Every Sunday when we come to celebrate the Eucharist, we are urged to come in our "Sunday Best."

CONFIRMATION THIS SPRING - On Tuesday of this week our candidates for the sacrament of Confirmation will be confirmed by Bishop Mark at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. We are very proud of our young people as they continue their journey of Discipleship: *Joseph Colombo, Ava Dolphin, Nicholas Helsley, Jacob Kormanski, Nevaeh Langenbacher, Emily Miller, and Trenton Wandersee.* We keep them in our prayers as they prepare for this important moment in their lives.



TRULY RISEN!

The Lord is truly risen, alleluia! (Easter entrance antiphon)

All during Lent the first readings of the liturgy were drawn from the Old Testament and told stories of the family of those who came before Jesus. When Jesus rose on Easter the people who loved and followed him in his life became part of the new family known as Christians. On the Sundays of Easter we will read about their stories from the New Testament book called the Acts of the Apostles. You are one of these Christians. Each Easter, we have the chance to imagine ourselves standing at the empty tomb with the apostles. Together we believe that Jesus is not among the dead but is "truly risen" and with us today.
