RCIA: A NEW NAME, A RENEWED SPIRIT - For many years, RCIA has indicated the "Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults." It has become apparent, however, that this process of becoming a Roman Catholic is much more than a "Rite." It is a process of preparation for entrance into the church which entails prayer, study, and the companionship of committed Catholics. The American Bishops have encouraged us to now speak of it as the OCIA, the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. The traditional categorization of those petitioning for full acceptance into the Church has also been changed. The new revision includes: catechumens (who are unbaptized adults); baptized non-Catholic Christians, and adult baptized Catholics in need of Confirmation. With Covid behind us, it is most appropriate that we renew our commitment to our outreach to those wishing to learn more about the Faith, and who may seek full initiation into the Church. We are most grateful to Mark Krepich, who for several years has directed this ministry. We are now seeking additional team members who can share in this work of evangelization. This ministry is fundamentally one of accompaniment: Catholics willing to accompany those desiring to be Catholic. Please consider this invitation to share your faith with others.
