A Few Words from the Pastor:

A CLASS REUNION - our closest friendships are often those that were formed when we are yet in school! For several summers, I have enjoyed some time away in the company of former classmates, friends who go all the way back to high school! I will be enjoying their company this week and pray that you have similar friendships!

SACRED STORY PRAYER, modeled on St. Ignatius's classic examination of conscience, is a proven path to spiritual growth. It is the narrow road but the one taken by many saints and ordinary laity in the church's history. If you are ready to make Christ the center of your life, you will find no better daily spiritual prayer discipline. At the beginning of each of the 40 weeks, we are given sacred story affirmations designed to strengthen us on our journey. The first is the simple reminder that "my sacred story takes a lifetime to write." Each one of us has a story to tell, the story of success and failure, victory and defeat, sin and forgiveness. Sacred story prayer asks that we spend about 15 minutes each day in prayer and reflection. The 40 weeks is the journey of a lifetime!

Binoj Mathew serves as the Novice Master for the Immaculate Heart of Mary Province, USA. At each Mass Father will ask for our prayers and financial assistance as his Order works to expand its ministry of Catholic education in Kamrup (Assam) India. Most of the Christians in this secluded part of the country belong to tribal communities and are often persecuted for their faith by non-Christian tribes. This expansion will allow the school to add additional grade levels, dormitories for boarding students, a Monastery for the religious, a playground for the younger children, and an auditorium. 


