A Few Words from the Pastor:

A SAINT FOR OUR YOUNG: St. Maria Goretti is unique in that she is the youngest canonized saint in the Church. She died tragically on July 6, 1902, at the age of eleven as she was stabbed to death by a neighbor who forced himself upon her and was seeking to rape her. She is not only a model of purity and obedience but is noted for her generous forgiveness of the young man who assaulted her. In our own age, when everything is so sexualized and there is the everpresent risk of sexual predators on social media, we must hold up our saint Maria Goretti as a model of virtue and prudence for the young women who face such dangers and temptations.

RENEWING PARISH LIFE: Father Norris and I, along with other priests and parishioners of the diocese, attended a workshop this week focused on revitalizing parish life. Based upon a program entitled "Divine Renovation," the direction suggested for parishes was that we move from "maintenance to mission." In a word, it means that we consider not just how to "survive," but how to "THRIVE!" Sessions included discussions on how to renew parish councils, with a vision of how our parishes can move forward with vision and confidence! More information in the weeks ahead!

MISSION APPEAL: On August 5 & 6, 2023, Fr. Binoj Mathew, O.SS.T. (Order of the Most Holy Trinity and of the Captives) will be in our parish for a mission appeal. Fr. Binoj Mathew serves as the Novice Master for the Immaculate Heart of Mary Province, USA. At each Mass Father will ask for our prayers and financial assistance as his Order works to expand its ministry of Catholic education in Kamrup (Assam) India. Most of the Christians in this secluded part of the country belong to tribal communities and are often persecuted for their faith by non-Christian tribes. In this part of the county children do not have access to a proper education due to extreme poverty and persecution. The Trinitarians in India hope to expand their ministry of Catholic education through their newly opened DeMatha Elementary School. This expansion will allow the school to add additional grade levels, dormitories for boarding students, a Monastery for the religious, a playground for the younger children, and an auditorium. The Trinitarians are hopeful that your generosity during this Mission Appeal will help them to more effectively live their school's motto, "Educate to Liberate." The Church directs a sign of reverence be shown before receiving Communion standing. The bishops of the United States have determined that the sign of reverence is a bow. This gesture expresses our reverence and honor to Christ who comes to us in the Most Blessed Sacrament. The consecrated Host may be received on the tongue or on the hand at the discretion of the communicant. The sign of reverence, a bow, is also made before receiving the precious Blood. This liturgical reverence speaks of our devotion and love of the Body and Blood of Christ which we are about to receive. The bow is also a sign of gratitude for such a sacred gift. C.f. Introduction to the Order of Mass, 2011, Number 160.

Saint Junipero Serra

Saint Junipero Serra grew up in Spain, then became a missionary and traveled to the United States. He built missions and taught people about farming, cattle ranching, and Jesus.

He was canonized as a saint in 2015.
