A Few Words from the Pastor:

OUR SACRED STORY RETREAT BEGINS THIS WEEKEND! Even if you have not yet gotten a book, more have been ordered. I will take time each weekend to give the focus of the week, encouraging us to take those 15 minutes daily to deepen our life of prayer and our love for Christ. As we begin with Week 1, take time to read the introductory pages and then carefully follow the guidance which Father Watson, our author, provides. Each Sunday I will comment on the week that is beginning, giving encouragement as we embark on this spiritual journey. St. Ignatius of Loyola, pray for us!

TAKE LORD, RECEIVE! Throughout the time of our retreat, we will be offering a special prayer after communion, a prayer that comes from the heart of St. Ignatius. We will also be distributing holy cards with two of his most popular prayers.

A NEW ROOF! Our new roof is complete! Interestingly, as they were banging away on the roof in the morning and we were inside celebrating daily Mass, our readings from the Old Testament were telling the story of the rebuilding of the temple after the Babylonian Exile.
