# A Few Words from the Pastor:

**WELCOME, STEPHANIE BAKER:** A belated but sincere welcome to our parish staff is extended to Stephanie Baker, who began during the summer to serve as our parish business manager. An alumna of St. John's school, Stephanie is the daughter of Ron and Becky Merilli. Stephanie and her husband Brodie share two children, Dominic who is in 7<sup>th</sup> grade at Bishop Guilfoyle and Payton who is in her 3<sup>rd</sup> year at Penn State. We welcome her "home" to our parish family!

**40 WEEKS: PRELIMINARIES!** Before embarking on the 40 Weeks, you are encouraged to read pages 1 – 12 of our text. You will notice that our author asks that you spend the first week or two reading one of the four gospels (your choice). He recommends that you consider a chapter or two each day, taking this time to immerse yourself in the life of Jesus and his teachings. So that we can be on the same page as a parish, I would suggest that **we actually begin Week I on the first Sunday of October.** That will give plenty of time to read a gospel slowly and prayerfully over the next two weeks. Our author reminds us not to be looking ahead, but to use these first days to prayerfully enter the world and life of Jesus. *St. Ignatius of Loyola, pray for us!* 

**A NEW ROOF!** You will certainly notice that a new roof is being installed on our church. With the guidance of the parish finance Council, several bids were solicited, and our work has commenced. The cost for this project is \$34,000. Many thanks to all of those who so regularly support our parish family. Additional gifts to assist this roofing project are welcome!

**ELECTRICAL WORK IN THE GYM AND KITCHEN** - Because of the increased use of Bailey Hall for social events, and the frequency of fuses being blown because of the overload of appliances for such events, we are looking into an upgrade of our electrical system in the cafeteria and hall.

**REACHING OUT TO OUR HOMEBOUND** - Our parish council on Monday discussed one of the most important ways that we serve the members of our parish family. Because there are so many who are homebound, we are undertaking a special initiative to regularly reach out with visits and the Eucharist to all of those who are not able to join us for Sunday liturgy. We will be soliciting volunteers for this ministry and ask that if you have anyone who is homebound and is not currently being visited, please call the parish office. Mary Susick will be coordinating this ministry. Given the great inspiration of Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta, the Council decided to name this as our "Mother Teresa Ministry."

"LET JUSTICE AND PEACE FLOW" – This is the theme of this year's ecumenical *Season of Creation*, inspired by the words of the prophet Amos: "Let justice flow on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream" (5:24). The evocative image used by Amos speaks to us of what God desires. God wants everyone to strive to be just in every situation, to live according to his laws and thus to enable life to flourish. September 1 was declared by Pope Francis as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. This time of prayer and reflection will extend until October 4, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi.

**FAITH FORMATION AND CHILDREN"S LITURGY:** Our Faith Formation program has begun again for our students in Kindergarten through 11th grade. We had a great turn out last Sunday for our Parent Meeting and Meet the Teacher and students and catechists alike seems excited to get back into the classrooms together! We also welcome our Faith Formation students this Sunday, September 17th, who will be participating in the various ministries during the 11am Mass. We are grateful for their interest in sharing the ministries that enrich our Sunday Mass and are most appreciative of all those who have helped prepare them.

#### **FALL ADULT FAITH FORMATION TOPICS:**

<u>September 17 to October 1: Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist</u>. This series explores "the truth and beauty of Christ's real presence in the Eucharist, from its origins in Sacred Scripture, to its profound role in the life of the Church and her members.

October 8 to November 19: *The Search* The Search, hosted by Chris Stefanick, guides us through seven videos examining life and death, sorrow and happiness, and science and faith. Astrophysicists, psychologists, astronauts, neuroscientists, professors, athletes, artists, and the beauty of the cosmos all point us to the person of Jesus Christ.

We meet on Sunday mornings from 9:00 to 10:30 in the St. Johns school cafeteria. Please consider joining us for food, fellowship, and the opportunity to deepen your faith.
