A Few Words from the Pastor:

40 WEEKS: PREPARING FOR THE JOURNEY! It has been encouraging that so many have taken a **40 Weeks** book for our parish retreat! More have been ordered! Before embarking on the 40 Weeks, you are encouraged to read pages 1 – 12 of our text. You will notice that our author asks that you spend the first week or two reading one of the four gospels (your choice). He recommends that you consider a chapter or two each day, taking this time to immerse yourself in the life of Jesus and his teachings. So that we can be on the same page as a parish, I would suggest that **we will begin Week I next Sunday, the first Sunday of October.** That will give plenty of time to read a gospel slowly and prayerfully over the next week. Our author reminds us not to be looking ahead, but to use these first days to gently enter the world and life of Jesus. *St. Ignatius of Loyola, pray for us!*

A NEW ROOF! We continued to make progress on our new roof. The cost for this project is \$37,000. Many thanks to all of those who so regularly support our parish family. Additional gifts to assist this roofing project are welcome!

PET BLESSING – Next Sunday, October 8, at 1:00 PM, we will have our annual pet blessing. Coming just a few days after the feast of St. Francis and the conclusion of the Season of Creation, we are grateful for the way in which our pets are such a wonderful sign of the goodness of God.

REACHING OUT TO OUR HOMEBOUND - Because there are so many who are homebound, we are undertaking a special initiative to regularly reach out with personal visits and the Eucharist to all of those who are not able to join us for Sunday liturgy. And the question comes to my mind: What does cultivating and caring for the earth mean? Are we truly cultivating and caring for creation? Or are we exploiting and neglecting it?"
