A Few Words from the Pastor:

OUR SACRED STORY RETREAT – WEEK THREE: Reading and reflecting on the lives of the saints can provide great inspiration. We are lifted up by the courage and perseverance of those who have gone before us. Last week and again this week our sacred story retreat invites us to continue reflecting upon the life of St. Ignatius of Loyola. His is a story of conversion, which is be our story as well, as we turn away from self-centeredness and toward Christ. This call to holiness is evident in these words of our Saint Ignatius:

There are very few who realize what God would make of them if they abandoned themselves entirely to his hands and let themselves be formed by his grace. A thick and shapeless tree trunk would never believe that it could become a statute, admired as a miracle of sculpture, and would never consent to submit itself to the chisel of the sculptor who, as St. Augustine says, sees by his genius what he can make of it. Many people who now scarcely live as Christians, do not understand that they could become saints, if they would but let themselves be formed by the grace of God, if they did not ruin his plans by resisting the work which he wants to do. TAKE LORD, RECEIVE! Throughout the time of our retreat, we will be offering a special prayer after communion, a prayer that comes from the heart of St. Ignatius. In a homily on the occasion of a special "Ignatian Year," the Superior General of the Jesuits helped us see the love for the Eucharist in Ignatius' prayer: *Is there a eucharistic prayer which dares* "highly and humbly" to translate the "this is my body" like the one at the "take Lord, receive" (which we pray each Sunday after Communion): to allow the Lord to take freedom and memory, intelligence and will, having and being, to receive the gift of love and grace which is yourself, the body of Christ, the blood of Christ for the life of the world? The Eucharist, "for this is all I need".

MEETING FOR SACRED STORY RETREAT –On Wednesday, November 1st, following evening Mass, there will be a special meeting for all those who have begun to make our 40 weeks retreat and who have questions regarding the retreat of who have interest in being part of a small group. This meeting will last but an hour, and all are welcome.

Given the great inspiration of Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta, the Council decided to name this as our "Mother Teresa Ministry."

NOTES ON OUR PARISH COUNCIL MEETING – Hospitality was a strong focus of our council meeting last Monday. WE discussed continuing on a quarterly basis "Name Tag Sunday", which helps us get to know those who are new to us! We spoke as well of the need for a "Welcome Wagon" to visit the home of those new to the parish. The need for additional Hospitality Ministers was addressed. Can we perhaps invite Families to serve in this ministry? Mom and Dad and kids? Hospitality is the essential virtue of a parish, as we celebrate the welcome which Christ extends to us and which we extend to others!
