# A Few Words from the Pastor:

WEEK 6: LIFE'S UPS AND DOWNS! This week in our sacred story retreat we are invited to move from considering the life of St. Ignatius, to reflecting upon the persons, issues, and life events that have shaped our own life story. We seek the grace to understand how those things, in both a negative or positive way, have shaped our thoughts, actions, feelings, and beliefs that are linked to God, the world and ourselves. Conscious of the words of the philosopher Plato, that "the unexamined life is not worth living," we now move to that part of the retreat when we are looking more closely at ourselves, considering what life events have brought us closer to God, or have affected us in a negative way. I am asked to make a list of those positive and negative persons or life events, and to consider how God is working in my life. Remember that nothing is lost to God's redeeming grace, and that God will use all things to draw us nearer to himself.

**INTERFAITH THANKSGIVING SERVICE FOR PEACE AND HEALING:** The dual values of healing ("tikkun" in Hebrew) and peace ("shalom") are at the heart of this years' 92<sup>nd</sup> Annual Interfaith Thanksgiving Service on Thursday, November 16, 2023 at 7:00 PM at Sacred Heart Church, 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 20<sup>th</sup> Street, Altoona. Hosted by the Sixth-Ward Ministries, this annual service of gratitude plays an important role in bringing together all our faith communities. Father Lubomir Strecok and Sacred Heart Parish is hosting this years' service. All are encouraged to participate.

**THE SACRED STORY OF THE WEEK: ST FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI (1850 – 1917).** A native of Italy, Frances was well educated, becoming headmistress of an orphanage, and subsequently forming her own religious order, the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. In 1889, St. Frances set off for New York, along with six of her Sisters, to help the many impoverished Italian immigrants. They continued the Orders' great work of tending to the many orphaned children, the sick and the poor. In total, St Frances set up 67 institutions ranging from homes to hospitals throughout North and South America and Europe. She is the first American Citizen Saint, and universal patron Saint of immigrants! Her prayer: *Pray that we will see the poor and marginalized as members of our own family and reach out to welcome and help them.* Her feast day is Monday, November 13<sup>th</sup>.
