A Few Words from the Pastor:

THANKSGIVING DAY MASS: Thanksgiving has been on the liturgical calendar for the United States since 1970. **As is our parish tradition, we will gather at 9:00 AM to celebrate the greatest prayer of thanksgiving, the Eucharist**. The British writer and Catholic philosopher G.K. Chesterton is quoted as saying: "The worst moment for an atheist is when he is really thankful and has no one to thank." Today, football games and dining room tables filled with food tend to overshadow the real meaning of Thanksgiving for American citizens, even Catholic ones. It is important for people to come together on this special day, celebrating that sense of community when we come together to thank God for our lives, our families, our freedom, our abilities. Do join us, won't you?

WEEK 7: THE TEN COMMANDMENTS -- As we approach the Advent season, it is most appropriate for us to do a good examination of conscience, particularly since we will be celebrating a reconciliation service on December 3. My prayer this week is that God will give us the grace to identify how the 10 Commandments fit into my life as a gift to bring awareness, healing, balance, and God's peace. I will also ask God for the grace to identify the deepest hope of my heart for my life and my future.

THIS WEEK'S SACRED STORY: Saint Cecilia, A Roman virgin martyr of the third century, is honored on November 22 as the patron saint of music and is a symbol of the central role of music in liturgy. It is said that she heard heavenly music when she was married. Because of her ties to music, she is often depicted in art, statues and religious items with a harp, organ or other musical instruments. At our own cathedral in Altoona, the stained glass window behind the organ pictures Cecilia holding an organ. "Music is the greatest creation man has ever made. It has the power to move us and free our souls. It's the breathing of the earth and the lullaby of the universe. In spirituality, music can bridge reality to the spiritual realm. It can uplift our spirits and transform us through the charming spell it radiates." How blessed is our parish for its long tradition of quality liturgical music. I am convinced that music draws us closer to God, because music so often comes from another time and place.
