CHRISTMAS MASSES! We celebrate the Mass of The Lord's Birth on Christmas eve at 4:00 PM, Christmas Night at 10:00 PM, and Christmas Morning at 10:00 AM. Glory to God in the Highest!

OUR GRATITUDE – The unmatched generosity of St. John's parishioners has again been shown in the outpouring of gifts which have been given to needy children through our annual Angel Tree. Many smiles will come upon many faces this Christmas! A special thanks to Carolyn English and to Ray and Mary King for her help in coordinating this very worthy project!

OPLATKI -This Christmas wafer is a popular, family-centered Christmas tradition enjoyed by families from <u>Eastern Europe</u>. The Oplatki tradition originated in Poland and is traced to the early centuries of Christianity. This Christmas custom began with a simple white wafer baked from flour and water. The word means "Angel Bread," and the wafer is shared before the Christmas Eve dinner. These wafers are available in the Gathering Space.

SOLEMNITY OF MARY THE MOTHER OF GOD – January 1st is a Holy Day of Obligation, as we honor Mary, the Mother of God. There will not be a vigil Mass, but a Mass for the whole St. John's community will be offered at 10:00 that morning! What better way to begin the New Year than by placing our parish family under Mary's protection!

WEEK 12 OF OUR SACRED STORY RETREAT: My quiet prayer time this week is given over to finishing the letter that I began last week, a personal letter to Christ Jesus, asking for his help and healing for my story. I will also this week take a generous amount of time to simply reflect up the birth of Jesus and the meaning of Christmas in my own life. I will make special effort to see Christ in each person I meet!

NO ROOM IN THE INN: THE HOMELESS IN ALTOONA -- As we celebrate Christmas in the warmth and security of our homes, it is important not to forget that there are about fifty unsheltered people on the streets of Altoona every night. This does not include the 30 people at the Family Shelter or those housed by agencies in motel rooms every night, which is a significant drain on their limited budgets. It is also disturbing that are between 100 and 200 children in the Altoona school district without a permanent address. Most of these families are doubled up in homes with relatives or friends, with no home of their own.

WE CAN HELP! – Efforts to respond to the need for our city's homeless has led to the creation of A Warming Center, led by Altoona Fire Chief Adam Free. Chief Free is requesting that area churches provide teams of volunteers to staff the new warming center at Overflow Church that will be open nightly for 20 guests from 9:00 PM until 7:00 AM beginning January 8 and ending March 31. One team of four volunteers (two male and two female) is needed each night. Churches may help us meet this critical need by sending a team of volunteers weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly. STEWARDSHIP CORNER: Our God is mighty, all-powerful and Love itself. The only proper response is to worship Him and live our lives as a grateful gift for all His goodness to us. But how can we possibly live up to this task? Only by relying on God, as St Paul tells us in the Second Reading, from his letter to the Romans. Paul instructs us to go to "him who can strengthen you... Jesus Christ." The truth is, once we recognize that all we have is a gift from God, the next step is to acknowledge that we need God's strength and wisdom to guide us in the best use of those gifts for the building of His Kingdom. Hopefully, we are making time during Advent to go to God in prayer and through the sacraments to obtain the strength we need to live as His disciples and the guidance to know we are indeed following His will with the gifts He has entrusted to us. In fact, our aim should be to make the words of our Blessed Mother our own. We read in today's Gospel passage from Luke the wonderful words of her 'fiat', her 'yes' to God's plan. "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." These are among the most beloved words in the Gospel. But the next sentence is also important for the Christian steward. After Mary's fiat, we read "Then the angel departed from her." Our Blessed Mother was left with a lot of unexplained details about God's plan for her. Yet, she followed God's will perfectly! She gave herself and her life fully to God as a gift. She trusted in her Heavenly Father to guide her at each step, and He did. She was the first disciple. We are called to follow her example as disciples today. The Christmas, let us resolve to make our whole life a gift to the One Who has given us everything. It is the work of a lifetime. But He will give us all the help and strength we need to do it.
