A Few Words from the Pastor:

SOLEMNITY OF MARY THE MOTHER OF GOD – Mass for this feast of Mary will be offered at 10:00 that morning on New Years Day! What better way to begin the New Year than by placing our parish family under Mary's protection!

ALPHA AT ST. JOHN'S - ALPHA will again be coming to our parish in January. Alpha is a series of sessions which explore the Christian faith. Each talk looks at a different question and is designed to create conversation. No two Alpha's look the same, but generally it has three key experiences in common: food, a talk and conversation. Please join us!

WEEK 13 OF OUR SACRED STORY RETREAT: As the New Year begins, it might be good to recommit ourselves to the daily fifteen-minute quiet time. I will petition the Lord for the grace to keep sacred my times of prayer and strive to pray in a place that is technology-free, a quiet place apart. Make this your most important New Year's resolution.

SACRED STORIES: TWO AMERICAN SAINTS – This week the Church in the USA celebrates TWO of its own: Saint John Neumann (1811-1860) and Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton (1774-1821). Elizabeth Ann Seton was born to Episcopal parents in New York city, and later converted to Catholicism. Mother Seton was a strong proponent of Catholic education and is noted for founding the Parochial School System in America. She is the first native-born American to be canonized. The Sisters of Charity which she founded have had a long and storied history of service to our own diocese. Saint John Neumann was born in what is now the Czech Republic. After studying in Prague, he came to New York at 25 and was ordained a priest. He did missionary work in New York until he was 29, when he joined the Redemptorists and became its first member to profess vows in the United States. He continued missionary work in Maryland, Virginia and Ohio, where he became popular with the Germans. There are parishes in our own diocese where he visited and presided at Mass. He was well-known for his holiness and learning, spiritual writing and preaching. He became the first American bishop to be canonized, and is buried in St. Peter the Apostle Church in Philadelphia, where he served as its fourth bishop from 1852 until his death in 1860.

THE YEAR OF MARK – Our readings for Sunday Mass are given in a three-year cycle: **Year A** draws from the Gospel of Matthew, **year B** from the Gospel of Mark, and **year C**, the Gospel of Luke. At the beginning of the recent Advent season, we have begun Year B, with the Sunday gospels now predominantly coming from the Gospel of Mark. I am now preparing a Bible Study on Mark's Gospel which will help us appreciate this earliest and shortest of the Gospels. Stay tuned!

NO ROOM IN THE INN: THE HOMELESS IN ALTOONA -- WE **CAN HELP!** – Efforts to respond to the need for our city's homeless has led to the creation of A Warming Center, led by Altoona Fire Chief Adam Free. Chief Free is requesting that area churches provide teams of volunteers to staff the new warming center at Overflow Church that will be open nightly for 20 guests from 9:00 PM until 7:00 AM beginning January 8 and ending March 31. One team of four volunteers (two male and two female) is needed each night. Churches may help us meet this critical need by sending a team of volunteers weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly.
