# A Few Words from the Pastor:

**SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD: JANUARY 21!** This Sunday, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, Pope Francis asks that we observed the <u>Sunday of the Word of God</u>. He declared it "a Sunday given over entirely to the Word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people." *A special blessing will be given on your bible, and on you as a bible reader!!* 

**CELEBRATING OUR YOUNG PEOPLE:** In their journey toward Confirmation, our 9<sup>th</sup> Graders will participate in a special "Rite of Blessing" at today's 11:00 Mass. At the same Mass, our 10<sup>th</sup> Graders will celebrate the "Rite of Commitment." We affirm our young people in their journey of faith!

<u>WEEK 15</u> OF OUR SACRED STORY RETREAT: NARCISSISM! It makes me the center of the universe and arbiter of all truth. It displaces God so that I can be "like a god." The Narcissist is the ultimate "self-centered" person. Becoming aware of my self-centeredness is a positive move toward spiritual growth. When we notice such narcissism in ourselves, we are to set our eyes and hearts on Christ Jesus, the Divine Physician. An essential goal of the retreat is to acknowledge ourselves as hopelessly self-centered, and to place God and my neighbor at the center of my life. When asked about Jesus, St. John the Baptist said, "He must increase, I must decrease!" We pray about this throughout the week, asking the Divine Physician to heal us from the inside out, taking from us our stoney hearts and giving us a heart that is more like his own Sacred Heart.

THE YEAR OF MARK: A PARISH BIBLE STUDY —Our gospel readings for Sunday Mass in 2024 will be taken from the gospel of Mark. On Wednesday evenings following our 6:00PM Mass, I will be leading a bible study on Mark in the Parish Center, beginning at 6:45PM. There will be video presentations by the noted biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine, as well as ample time for discussion. Sessions will last no more than 90 minutes. We will begin on January 31<sup>st</sup>, (skipping Ash Wednesday because of our Soup Supper), and continue until the March 20<sup>th</sup>—seven sessions in all. This will be an enriching way to experience Lent. Please join us. Printed materials will be available. Bring your favorite bible and prepare to embark on an inspiring Lenter Journey.

**READING THE BIBLE** – As we observe the Sunday of the Word of God, it is a good opportunity to begin (or begin again!) to read the bible daily. This is an essential part of our Sacred Story retreat, as we read the "Greatest Story Ever Told."

#### **SUGGESTIONS FOR BIBLE READING:**

- 1. CHOOSE A BIBLE version that's understandable and easy to read. There are even bibles online.
- 2. YOU DON'T HAVE TO START AT THE BEGINNING of the Bible.

Since this is the Year of Mark, this is a good place to start.

- 3. READ A LITTLE EACH DAY, perhaps just one chapter, for five or ten minutes a day, reading slowly and prayerfully.
- 4. Read for INFORMATION but especially for INSPIRATION. It is not how many verses you read, but how you carefully listen to God speaking to your life.
- 5. As you read the Bible ASK TWO QUESTIONS: What does this teach me about God? What does this teach me about myself and how I should live?
- 6. ALWAYS BEGIN AND END WITH PRAYER! Pause before you open your Bible and ask God to speak to you. When finished, ask God to help you remember his word spoken to you, His love letter written to His people, and especially for you!

**WARMING CENTER:** Are There Homeless in Altoona? There are indeed homeless people in Altoona. As Christians we are asked by God to help those in need. We at St. John's have been addressing the needs of the poor for many years. Your generosity through out the year with clothing, food and monetary donations every Second Sunday is a huge help to Food Banks and those in need. As the cold and wet weather arrive, a group of concerned community members are addressing the issue of homeless individuals. There a lot of issues and we can only do a few at a time. This committee is made up of Agencies and concerned Christians. There first endeavor is a warming center open from January until March 31, 2024. This year the center is located at Over Flow Church at 127-5 Avenue, Altoona PA. Each evening at 9:00PM people come to the center and register for a cot to sleep on. Many agencies are present to evaluate their needs. There are 80 volunteers who take turns spending the night. Two for the women who sleep upstairs and two men who sleep downstairs. A guard is hired and present at all times. At this time no children are allowed but the committee is working to include children in the future. The guests leave at 7:00AM after light breakfast donated by Green Bean. If you would like to help, please give money to St. John's and mark Warming Shelter on an envelope or check. **STEWARDSHIP CORNER:** Our readings today call us to be decisive in our faith. God calls us as stewards to repent and renew our commitment to Him each day. In our First Reading, God instructs the prophet Jonah to travel through the city of Nineveh and warns the people that the city would be destroyed due to their evil ways. When the people of Nineveh heard this, they declared a fast in repentance. The Lord saw this and had compassion for them. Every moment is an opportunity to either grow closer to God or further away from Him. Our Gospel today shares Mark's account of Jesus calling His first disciples. In his account, Jesus approaches Simon and Andrew, and later, James and John. These four men were fishermen, casting their nets. Jesus states, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." In both instances, the men immediately abandoned what was before them and followed Christ. As we settle into this New Year, let us ponder the ways we can repent and renew our commitment to God. Let us ask ourselves, what are we casting our nets for? And are we willing to leave it behind for something much greater? If not now, when?
