A Few Words from the Pastor:

<u>WEEK 16</u> OF OUR SACRED STORY RETREAT: WHAT IS MOST IMPORTANT IN MY DAY? We rarely miss a meal and simply cannot function without sleep! If my physical needs are important, how much more is the time I take to direct my conscious attention – my mind and heat – to God in a prayer relationship. Not only is my relationship with God the most important dimension of life, it is also a relationship that takes time – a lifetime – to build! The depth of the relationship I desire will be evident in my fidelity to my prayer and sacramental life. As Jesus reminds us, "where your treasure is, there your heart will be"! Daily Bible reading can be a key element of your growth in Christ!

THE YEAR OF MARK: A PARISH BIBLE STUDY —Our gospel readings for Sunday Mass in 2024 will be taken from the gospel of Mark. On Wednesday evenings following our 6:00PM Mass, I will be leading a bible study on Mark in the Parish Center, beginning at 6:45PM. There will be video presentations by the noted biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine, as well as ample time for discussion. Sessions will last no more than 90 minutes. We will begin on January 31st, (skipping Ash Wednesday because of our Soup Supper), and continue until the March 20th—seven sessions in all. This will be an enriching way to experience Lent. Please join us. Printed materials will be available. Bring your favorite bible and prepare to embark on an inspiring Lenten Journey.

NATIONAL CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK is an annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States. Now entering its 50th anniversary year, Catholic Schools Week begins on January 28th and continues until February 3rd. We are blessed here in the Altoona area to have a strong Catholic School presence, with Most Holy Trinity Elementary School and Bishop Guilfoyle Catholic High School. We affirm the commitment and sacrifices which parents and parishes make in providing a Faith-centered environment where our children can grow in their love for God and in their formation as disciples of Jesus Christ.

ASH WEDNESDAY + VALENTINE'S DAY: An interesting combination! The date of Easter is set for the first Sunday after the first full moon of the spring Equinox. It can fall as early as March 22, or as late as April 25th. This year it is on March 31st. By a coincidence of the calendar, backing up to the beginning of Lent, we find that our celebration of Ashes and Valentines occur together!

LIVE! MARK'S GOSPEL! On Sunday, February 4th, (a no football Sunday!) at 2:00 PM, in our Parish Center, we will view the "Gospel of Mark" performed by noted actor Max McLean! McLean has made it his life's work to make the Bible come alive for his audiences. He has performed the books of Mark, Acts, and Genesis to millions of people on television and radio and theater. Experience Mark's gospel through Maclean's dynamic and at times humorous narration. Refreshments will be provided!

FRIDAY IS CANDLEMAS DAY - We commonly think of February 2nd as Ground Hog Day. In the Church, however, Candlemas Day celebrates the 40th day since Christmas, and is also known as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ, the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the Feast of the Meeting of the Lord. It is a Christian Holy Day commemorating the presentation of the Child Jesus in the Temple. It is based upon the account of the presentation of Jesus in the Gospel of Luke.

MEMORIAL OF ST. BLAISE – There is a beautiful tradition in the Church when we bless throats on St. Blaise day, February 3rd. We will do individual blessing of throats, as well as a communal blessing at the end of next weekend's Masses.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER: Our readings today remind us of God's authority. If we willingly give God authority over our lives and trust in His provision, He will take care of us no matter what. Our Gospel today reminds us why we want to give God this authority. Jesus was teaching in the synagogue on the Sabbath. All were fixed on His words and astonished at what He had to say. Suddenly everyone's attention shifted to a man with an unclean spirit who began to question Jesus and His authority. Jesus responded, "Quiet, come out of him!" and removed the evil spirit from the man. All were amazed at the healing of this man. Life can sometimes look like the synagogue in Capernaum. We are living as disciples of Christ, when we suddenly recognize evil around us – through events in our lives, temptations we are enduring, or by falling into sin. It can distract us, consume our attention, or even cause us to despair. In these moments of trial, we must remember the Healer in our Gospel today. Recall His words, "Quiet, come out of him!" Jesus has the power and authority over evil, for He has conquered sin and death. He also has the power and authority over us. And when we invite Him to have the authority, He will heal us and help us persevere. Today, we are reminded that God is in control and that we want Him to be in control. He is the loving Healer that will work miracles in our lives if we give Him the authority to do so.
