A Few Words from the Pastor:

HOLY WEEK BEGINS: Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday (when Jesus made his final entrance into Jerusalem) and culminates with <u>Easter Sunday</u>. Walk with Jesus to the Cross on Calvary and rejoice at his Resurrection.

THE SACRED TRIDUUM: Sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Easter Sunday is considered the most solemn part of the liturgical year. This three-day period is referred to as the *Easter Triduum*, also known as the *Sacred Triduum*, or *Paschal Triduum* (three days). The Conference of Catholic Bishops reminds us: "*Though chronologically three days*, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery".

HOLY THURSDAY MASS AND ADORATION - The evening Mass on Holy Thursday is referred to as *The Mass of the Lord's Supper*. This is where the Church re-lives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified. Extra hosts are consecrated at this Mass to be used on Good Friday when no Mass will be celebrated. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament around the church, with continued adoration until 10PM.

GOOD FRIDAY: This is the day of the Lord's crucifixion, the day Jesus died for the sins of the world. - This is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence. The parish altar looks very different on Good Friday: it is plain and bare. There is no consecrated Host in the tabernacle at the main altar of the church; it was carried away on Holy Thursday night to the "altar of repose" to signify Jesus' death. The candle by the tabernacle is blown out, and the tabernacle doors are left open to show that it is empty. Jesus is gone. This is quite dramatic, reminding us that Good Friday is a solemn day of mourning and prayer. The ceremony on Good Friday is not a Mass—it is a communion service using the consecrated hosts from Holy Thursday. Good Friday is the only day of the year on which no Masses are offered.

HOLY SATURDAY: On this day Christ is in the tomb. There is no daytime Mass on Holy Saturday. It is still a day of fasting and sorrow before the Easter Vigil begins that evening. We recall, with Mary and the disciples, that Jesus died and was separated from them for the first time as He lay in the tomb. The faithful often continue their Good Friday fast through Holy Saturday.

THE BLESSING OF THE EASTER BASKET: This has been a cherished Catholic ritual for centuries among families of Eastern European origin and adopted by people of all ethnic backgrounds. On Holy Saturday, families prepare their Easter Baskets to be later blessed. Our Easter Basket blessing will take place on Holy Saturday at noon. Please come and bring your baskets!

THE EASTER VIGIL - A vigil Mass is held after nightfall on Holy Saturday, or before dawn on Easter Sunday, in celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. This is called the Easter Vigil: the most glorious, beautiful, and dramatic liturgy for the Church. The vigil is divided into four parts: 1) the Service of Light, 2) the Liturgy of the Word, 3) the Liturgy of Baptism, and 4) the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

EASTER SUNDAY: The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes it this way: "Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the 'Feast of feasts', the 'Solemnity of solemnities', just as the Eucharist is the 'Sacrament of sacraments'. St. Athanasius calls Easter 'the Great Sunday' and the Eastern Churches call Holy Week 'the Great Week'.

TENEBRAE – Tenebrae is the Latin word for darkness and night. It is a religious service of Western Christianity held during the three days preceding Easter Day, and characterized by gradual extinguishing of candles, and by a "strepitus" or "loud noise" taking place in total darkness near the end of the service. Our Tenebrae service here at St. John's will be held this Tuesday evening at 7:00. Please join us for this very moving ceremony!

<u>WEEK 25</u> OF OUR SACRED STORY RETREAT: We have been reflecting on the Five Step Structure of Daily Sacred Story Prayer: CREATION, PRESENCE, MEMORY, MERCY, ETERNITY. As holy week unfolds, how important it is to spend time each day meditating on the Suffering and death of the Lord Jesus. Acknowledge God's gift of life, become aware of your presence with him on the road to Calvary, remember that Jesus in making this journey for YOU, listen to the words of Jesus, "Father forgive them," and open your life to the fullness of grace flowing from the pierced side of Christ.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER: Today we celebrate Palm Sunday – the beginning of our Holy Week. Our liturgy starts with the account of Jesus humbly entering into Jerusalem riding a donkey. People put cloaks and palm branches in His pathway crying, "Hosanna, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" It is with great joy that Christ was being honored as king, still in the same breath, we are filled with sorrow as we reflect on Christ's passion and death. Thankfully, we know the glorious outcome of this painful journey. Today, as we read about the climax of Christ's mission here on earth, we are reminded that He is the Perfect Steward, a model for us all on our stewardship journey. Our First Reading, from the prophet Isaiah, portrays a suffering servant. The suffering servant, in may ways, foreshadows what Jesus endured during His passion – "I gave my back to those who beat me... my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting." Christ endured such tortures, knowing that He did not deserve them, but still He humbly submitted to them.
