A Few Words from the Pastor:

EASTER JOY: The promise of the Resurrection is the assurance that God's love, in every circumstance, is victorious, and that a new heaven and a new earth have come down out of heaven from God. We pray that with the eyes of faith we can see in our daily lives the radiant presence of the Redeemer, who in his Resurrection has made all things new!!!

EASTER SUNDAY: The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes it this way: "Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the 'Feast of feasts', the 'Solemnity of solemnities', just as the Eucharist is the 'Sacrament of sacraments'. St. Athanasius calls Easter 'the Great Sunday' and the Eastern Churches call Holy Week 'the Great Week'. The mystery of the Resurrection, in which Christ crushed death, permeates with its powerful energy our old time, until all is subjected to him."

"OUR SUNDAY BEST" - this expression has its roots in the way churchgoers prepare themselves to worship Christ the King! We put on our "Sunday best" as a sign of the honor with which we acknowledge Christ the Risen One. We certainly do it for Easter Sunday, when "we come dressed for an audience with the Living God." The Church teaches us that every Sunday is Easter! Every Sunday when we come to celebrate the Eucharist, we are urged to come in our "Sunday Best."

A PRAYER CANDLE FOR EASTER: We are making available this Easter small votive candles which will remind us during the Easter season of Christ's presence as the Light of the World. They can be a small reminder of the beauty of the Easter candle and can be placed next to an icon or crucifix. They can be lit at Easter dinner or anytime a person praying privately, aware that it is Christ who is our Light.

CONFIRMATION THIS SPRING: On Tuesday of this week our candidates for the sacrament of Confirmation will be confirmed by Bishop Mark at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. We are very proud of our young people as they continue their journey of Discipleship: Estella Koch, Jacob Kormanski, Leah Petrunak, Lauryn Ryan, John Sukala and Joulia Wolf. We keep them in our prayers as they prepare for this important moment in their lives.

OUR PARISH BIBLE STUDY: Our weekly meetings will resume this Wednesday, April 3rd, at 6:45 in the parish center. Our study will focus on the readings for the following Sunday. Please plan on joining us!

<u>WEEK 26</u> OF OUR SACRED STORY RETREAT: During this Easter Week, I would recommend that together with your daily Examen, you include daily reflections on the beautiful prayer of St. Ignatius which we have been praying at Mass each week: *Take, O Lord, and receive, all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will, all I have and call my own. You have given all to me. To you, O Lord, I return it. Everything is yours; do with it what you will. Give me only your love and your grace, that is enough for me. Pray this prayer slowly each day, allowing it to find its deepest roots in your heart.*
