I need always ask myself, in this decision that I make, will it bring me closer and more fully in God's service. Choosing between good and evil can be a rather simple path, though difficult. Discerning between two goods, however, does invite me to discern more deeply how God is working in my daily life and what he is calling me to do. It is always important as we make a decision to ask ourselves: which will give greater glory to God. Both decisions are good! The important word is "greater."
