# A Few Words from the Pastor:

**MASS OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK** – This Sunday, April 21<sup>st</sup>, at 2:00 PM, our parish will celebrate a special Mass of Anointing. Whether due to age or illness, those feeling the need for Christ's compassion are urged to receive this important sacrament of healing and grace. Whether you are enduring physical or spiritual distress, chronic depression or melancholy, Christ extends his healing touch and embrace.

A MIGHTY OAK TREE FALLS! – In last Sunday's strong winds, one of our mighty oak trees was lost, crashing onto Lotz Avenue between the rectory and the fire station at 8:15 pm. There were no injuries, and no damage to our facilities. There was, however, an amazing amount of clean-up needed. We were advised by the tree experts that the other two oaks in our front yard are also vulnerable to high winds, with decay showing in their root system. We will be getting some bids.

<u>WEEK 30:</u> OUR SACRED STORY RETREAT: The final section of Father Watson's 40 weeks retreat book focuses upon the rules of discernment as outlined by St. Ignatius of Loyola. Rather than wade through these rather dense pages of theology, I believe our best direction in these final weeks of our retreat is to revisit the sacred story affirmations which appear at the beginning of the book. **This week's affirmation:** 

My life's greatest tragedies can be transformed into my life's major blessings.

I will not tire of asking God for help, since God delights in my asking.

**THIS WEEK'S SAINT!** On April 25 we celebrate the Feast of Saint Mark the Evangelist. Although he was not a direct disciple of Jesus, Saint Mark is the author of one of the four Gospel accounts and played a vital role in spreading the Gospel as a missionary in the early church. There is strong evidence that Mark was a companion of St. Peter, so that when he writes, he is informed by the experience of St. Peter. The Sunday Cycle of readings for 2024 is the gospel of Mark. It is interesting that Mark is never mentioned by name in his own Gospel. We also note that Mark mentions the word "Gospel" more times than any of the other Gospel account authors; in fact, his eight mentions of the Gospel double the total of four mentions from all Matthew, Luke, and John combined! His feast we celebrate on Thursday of this week. Do join us!

FAMILIES AND THE GOSPEL: Today's gospel is a job description for Christian parents. For most people the most influential shepherds in their lives are their PARENTS. Every parent is called to be a "good shepherd" to "freely lay down their life" for their children, to "love" and "know" their children and to "lead" them so "they know your voice."

STEWARDSHIP CORNER: On this fourth Sunday of Easter, we hear that Jesus is the Good Shepherd and we are His sheep. In Jesus' time, a shepherd was someone who protected and guided his sheep. Jesus does this for us and so much more. He is the Shepherd that lays down His life for His sheep. This message calls us to reflect inward – do we allow Jesus to shepherd our lives? We are Christ's, even more than a child is to a parent. He created us, brought us forth into the world, and sustains our lives each day. Evil persists in our world so Jesus willingly laid down His life for us at Calvary so that we might be saved. He is our Shepherd, whether we remain in His flock or go astray. Whether we accept His care, protection, and guidance or not, He is our Good Shepherd. Let us look inward this week and ask ourselves, 'who is my Shepherd?' and 'have I gone astray?' Name the areas in your life that you have neglected and ask Jesus to bring you home. Pray for His mercy, seek His forgiveness in the sacraments and begin again. Remember that we are His and He is ready for us to come home, as He says, "I know mine, and mine know me."
