A Few Words from the Pastor:

FATHER'S DAY -Next Sunday we celebrate Father's Day. According to St. Pope John Paul II, the father has a special role in families in that he "reveals and relives on earth the very fatherhood of God" (Familiaris Consortio, 25). St. Pope John Paul II also writes that in their families, fathers are "called upon to develop a new attitude of love, manifesting towards their wives and children a charity that is both gentle and strong like that which Christ has for the Church" (Familiaris Consortio, 25). Thus, fathers who live out their vocation of fatherhood well, help their wives and children to better understand and receive the love of God. However, fatherhood is not just lived out in the context of the family. Some men are called to live out their fatherhood not as natural fathers, but as supernatural fathers dedicating their lives to raising up spiritual children as parish priests or as religious priests or brothers. On this Father's Day, be sure to thank the father figures in your life who gave you the great gift of life, taught you valuable life lessons, and nurtured your life of faith.

SUMMER IS FOR LEISURE - The Bible tells us that on the seventh day God rested. We are to do the same. Genuine, God-given leisure is an attitude of mind, a condition of the soul. It is an attitude of non-activity, an inward calm, of silence. It means not being busy, but letting things happen. It brings with it a certain serenity. It involves our sitting quietly and being content to let things take their course. It is the attitude of those who are open to everything; not of those who grab and grab hold, but those who leave the reins lose and are free and easy themselves. May God bless us with a leisurely summer, a summer blessed with leisure!
