A Few Words from the Pastor:

FATHER ASHOK RETURNS THIS WEEK: Following the mournful trip home to India for the funeral of his mother, Father Ashok returns this Friday. Along with pictures taken at the funeral Mass, Father asks that I share this message:

We had funeral Mass on 13th June at 11.00 am in my native parish church (St Joan of Arc). Nearly 25 priests concelebrated with me. My mother hailed from a parish church of St Antony (most famous and sought after saint in India after Mother Mary). She passed away on Tuesday (a day dedicated for St Antony) and was buried on 13th June on the feast of St. Antony. In fact, she died when I was doing the mass at our parish church in Lakemont. I believe she is with the Lord. She was a simple woman with strong faith in God. She dedicated her whole life just for me. I'm sure I'm a priest today because of her prayers. She loved me very much. All that she wanted was just to hear my voice saying I'm doing well. Medication is very expensive affair in India still we tried to give her all the possible treatment that we could. She was admitted in one of the best hospitals in the city. We spent too much money with the hope of saving her life. But we never thought that we would lose her.

THE FOURTH, CELEBRATING OUR INDEPENDENCE! - Our morning Mass on Thursday, July 4, will be celebrated at 9 o'clock. Please join us! Actually, we might more accurately speak of our need to celebrate our "interdependence", for as a nation we rely upon one another and the community of nations.

OUR SAINT FOR THE WEEK, ST. THOMAS! Perhaps the best-known event in his life is the one from which the phrase "doubting Thomas" developed. In John 20:19–29 he was not among those disciples to whom the risen Christ first appeared, and, when they told the incredulous Thomas, he requested physical proof of the Resurrection, fulfilled when Christ reappeared and specifically asked Thomas to touch his wounds. His sudden realization of truth ("My Lord and my God") made Thomas the first person to explicitly acknowledge Jesus' divinity. Thomas's subsequent history is uncertain. Later Christian tradition says Thomas extended his apostolate into India, where he is recognized as the founder of the Church of the Syrian Malabar Christians, or Christians of St. Thomas. We celebrate his life and ministry on July 3rd.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER: Our readings today remind us that our God is a tender and loving God. Our First Reading, from the book of Wisdom, helps answer a common question in our Catholic faith – why is there suffering and death? We are tempted to be angry at God for the death of loved ones or of innocent people. We are also tempted to be angry at Him for our sufferings – like illness, car troubles or a terrible week at work. Wisdom teaches us, "God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living." Rather, "God formed man to be imperishable; the image of his own nature he made him."

Whether we are healed like the little girl in our Gospel today in this life, or we carry our suffering with us until we reach the next, if we remain faithful, Jesus will one day say to us, "Little girl or little boy, I say to you, arise!" Today, let us reflect on how much our good and gracious God loves us. Remember that whatever we are suffering in this life, do not be afraid, God is right there with us. Offer it to Him, seek His healing and remain faithful so that one day we might rise.
