A PRAYER FOR OUR EARTH

All powerful God, you are present in the universe and in the smallest of your creatures. You embrace with your tenderness all that exists. Pour out upon us the power of your love,

that we may protect life and beauty.

Fill us with your peace, that we may live as brothers and sisters, harming no one. O God of the poor, help us to rescue the abandoned and forgotten of this earth, so precious in your eyes. Bring healing to our lives,

that we may protect the world and not prey on it,
that we may sow beauty, not pollution and destruction.

Touch the hearts of those who look only for gain at the expense of the poor and the earth.

Teach us to discover the worth of the whole of your creation,

to be filled with awe and contemplation,
to recognize that we are profoundly united with every creature
as we journey towards your infinite light. We thank you for being with us each day.
Encourage us, we pray, in our struggle, for justice, love and peace.

POPE LEO AND OUR BISHOPS ON VIOLENCE IN AMERICA: Following the assassination of conservative activist Charlie Kirk as well as the school shooting in Minneapolis in August, Pope Leo has spoken out forcefully against violence. In August he released a book of his first speeches, titled *Peace Be With You*, which emphasizes his commitment to an "unarmed and disarming" peace. The U.S. bishops' conference echo his sentiments, calling for prayer in a "perilous moment" and stating that "church leaders must emphasize that the roots of such violence lie in the rejection of God and of the dignity of the human person".
