As His Holiness Pope Francis so beautifully expressed it: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." Throughout this Jubilee year, we are called to reflect on God's boundless mercy and embrace our mission to live out the Gospel in everyday life.

# A Few Words from the Pastor:

**COME TO OUR MINISTRY FAIR!** If you are reading this on the way home in the car, turn around and come back to our Parish Ministry Fair in Bailey Hall (9:00 – 1:00)! For those who went to Saturday evening Mass, come back on Sunday and enjoy the fellowship of our Ministry Fair! This is a very practical but also deeply spiritual event in a Catholic parish. Its importance goes beyond "sign-ups" — it helps build up the parish as the living Body of Christ. Why should we take time to visit the fair? First, it reminds us that parish life isn't just attending Mass but involves actively participating in the mission of the parish. The fair can also help a parishioner find a ministry that suits them, one that fits their skills, schedule, and passion. Further, parishioners often know only a small circle of people. When you come to a ministry fair, you meet ministry leaders and volunteers and see the "family" dimension of parish life. A fair shows that the Church is a place where people care, serve, and grow — which can draw people deeper into faith.

**ADULT ED PAUSES THIS WEEK!** Because of our Ministry Fair, our Sunday morning adult ed gatherings will pause this Sunday, to resume on October 5. Our sessions are a deep dive into the CREED. Making use of content provided by the Augustine Institute and available on "Formed", each session will provide enlightening insight and engaging Q&A interaction. What better way to complete our Jubilee Year than by a journey into the basics of our Catholic Faith!

**DON'T BELIEVE ALL THAT YOU SEE ON THE INTERNET!** A search for "Pope Leo" on YouTube will turn up dozens of fake videos of the Holy Father purportedly making statements that range from the plausible, such as reflections on the Eucharist, to the unlikely, such as the announcement of his resignation. Most of the videos have received no more than a few hundred views, but some of the **deepfakes** have started to go viral. (The term "**deepfake**," coined less than a decade ago, refers to videos, photos, or audio recordings altered to *show people doing or saying things they have never said or done.*) Pope Leo himself recently noted an example of the confusion which these AI videos can cause. In an interview with an American journalist, the Pope recalled his surprise when an acquaintance asked him with concern if he was all right. AI-generated photographs of the Pope appearing to fall down a flight of stairs outside St. Peter's Basilica had circulated on the internet in June. The images, which caught the attention of an internet fact-checker, were "so good that they thought it was me," Pope Leo said. Of course, the photos were fake and the pope is fine!

**A GREAT WEEK FOR SAINTS:** The liturgical calendar this week will highlight the Archangels (Sept 29), St. Jerome (Sept 30), St Therese of the Child Jesus (Oct 1), the Holy Guardian Angels (Oct 2), and St. Francis of Assisi (Oct 4).

**THE SEASON OF CREATION**: This observance is meant to heighten our awareness of our need to care for the natural world and all its inhabitants! Though the "season" concludes with the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, our care for God's creation must continue year-round!
