**2025 JUBILEE YEAR:** The 2025 Jubilee will be centered on the theme "Pilgrims of Hope." As His Holiness Pope Francis so beautifully expressed it: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." Throughout this Jubilee year, we are called to reflect on God's boundless mercy and embrace our mission to live out the Gospel in everyday life.

### A Few Words from the Pastor:

THE SEASON OF CREATION, SEPTEMBER 1 – OCTOBER 4! The Season of Creation has a special significance for the Catholic Church, particularly since Pope Francis established 1 September as an annual World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. The Season of Creation is marked throughout the Christian world from 1 September to 4 October (Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi) and celebrates the joy of creation as well as encouraging awareness-raising initiatives to protect the natural environment. Throughout this holy season, our bulletin will carry quotes from Laudato Si, the encyclical on the environment by Pope Francis. Take time to reflect on the beauty of creation and consider your personal or family efforts in caring for our common home.

**ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE:** The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has called Catholics to a deeper reverence and respect for God's creation and encourages Catholics to respond to environmental challenges, especially as they disproportionately affect our poor and vulnerable neighbors across the United States and the world. Environmental justice ensures the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people, regardless of race, color, national origin, or income, in the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws and policies. This principle requires equitable access to a healthy environment and protection from disproportionate health and environmental hazards for all communities.

**ADULT ED RESUMES: I BELIEVE IN GOD!!** Our Sunday morning adult ed gatherings will resume on September 14th. Our sessions will be a deep dive into the CREED. Printed materials will be available, as well as video presentations. Making use of content provided by the Augustine Institute and available on "Formed", each session will provide enlightening insight and engaging Q&A interaction. What better way to complete our Jubilee Year than by a journey into the basics of our Catholic Faith!

**COUNCIL OF NICAEA:** On 20 May 2025, the Christian world commemorated the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening of the Council of Nicaea, which took place in Asia Minor (modern day Turkey) in the year 325. This was the first ecumenical council in history, and it produced the creed that, completed by the First Council of Constantinople in 381, has become the distinctive expression of the Church's faith in Jesus Christ. This anniversary occurs within the Jubilee Year, which is centered on the theme "Christ our Hope," and it coincides with the common celebration of Easter by Christians of both East and West. Additional anniversary events will occur in late October.
