**2025 JUBILEE YEAR:** The 2025 Jubilee will be centered on the theme "Pilgrims of Hope." As His Holiness Pope Francis so beautifully expressed it: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." Throughout this Jubilee year, we are called to reflect on God's boundless mercy and embrace our mission to live out the Gospel in everyday life.

## A Few Words from the Pastor:

**FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING:** Today the liturgical year closes, as it does each year, with the feast of Christ the King. This year, in fact, marks the hundredth anniversary of the feast. Though the roots of the feast are biblical, the feast itself is a modern innovation, established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. How shall we understand this day? We are called to acknowledge that our loyalty to Christ the King must supersede and check our loyalty to any ruler, any nation-state, any structure of corporate power. Our deepest problem today is not the evacuation of divinity from the public sphere, but rather the idolatry of the nation. As in Pius XI's time, authoritarian leaders try to harness Christianity to bolster their power. The Church needs to reject the unfaithful and counterproductive attempt to ride the coattails of authoritarians back to social relevance. Catholics and all Christians need to place discipleship before patriotism. We are not simply Americans who have "No Kings"; we are Christians who have no king but Jesus. (Commonweal Magazine, November 2025)

THE YEAR OF ST. MATTHEW – Our Sunday gospels come to us in a three-year cycle. The three synoptic gospels, Matthew, Mark and Luke lay out for us the life and ministry of Jesus. Next Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent, we begin a new Liturgical year, and this will be the Year of Matthew. Saint Matthew, also known as Levi, was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus and the traditional author of the Gospel according to Matthew. Before being called by Jesus, he worked as a tax collector in Capernaum—an occupation often viewed negatively in Jewish society. After accepting Jesus' invitation, Matthew became a devoted follower and later a key figure in spreading the Christian message. His Gospel, written primarily for a Jewish audience, emphasizes Jesus as the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy and highlights teachings such as the Sermon on the Mount. Christian tradition holds that Matthew preached in regions such as Judea and possibly Ethiopia or Persia.

**OUR THANKSGIVING DAY MASS, 9:00 AM** - While Thanksgiving in the United States is now largely a secular holiday, it has strong religious roots. Its religious significance generally centers on the core idea coming from Judeo-Christian traditions of offering gratitude to God for the blessings of a bountiful harvest. This celebration dates to the 1621 harvest feast shared by the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag Indians. Early Thanksgiving observances in the colonies often involved church services dedicated to praising God for protection, harvest, and community. This tradition continues to the present as churches and synagogues throughout our nation observe this day with prayers of thanksgiving, deeds of charity, and a general reflection on God's goodness.

CHRISTMAS GIFTS FROM THE HOLY LAND – Next weekend representatives of the Catholic community of Bethlehem will be here with religious items crafted in the Holy Land. This persecuted community is in great need of our support. Please be generous in your purchases.

**ADVENT PENANCE SERVICE, December 14**<sup>th</sup> – An important element in our spiritual life is the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. A personal confession to a priest requires humility and honesty. We cannot grow spiritually without this sacrament, for it invites us to encounter our sinfulness and to experience the healing of Christ, our Divine Physician. Our parish communal Penance Service will be celebrated on Sunday, December 14<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 PM. Please join us.

MADRIGAL FEAST JUBILEE: Despite the decline of congregational singing under the Medieval Church, musical forms were still being cultivated which were inspired by biblical texts. "Of the Father's Love Begotten" by Prudentius is from the 5th century, and its tune, DIVINUM MYSTERIUM from the 11th century. "All Glory Laud and Honor" by Theodulph of Orleans was written around 820. "All Creatures of our God and King" by Francis of Assisi was written in 1225. "Be Thou My Vision" is an Irish hymn from the 8th century. "O Sacred Head Now Wounded" was written by Bernard of Clairvaux in 1153. The tune we sing to "When I Survey" (HAMBURG) is based on a Gregorian chant. Our madrigal feast jubilee music will truly inspire our celebration of the newborn King of Kings. **STEWARDSHIP CORNER:** On this Feast of Christ the King, our readings show us that we serve the greatest of Kings, who is at the same time the humblest of Kings. Christ is the perfect model of servant leadership. And what an indescribable privilege that He has called us to be servant leaders – stewards in the work of advancing His Kingdom. What powerful lessons this King teaches us from the Cross. We learn that true leadership is displayed in emptying ourselves for others; that true greatness is displayed by way of humility; that none of us is worthy of the call to stewardship of His kingdom but that all of us, like the good thief, are welcomed and invited to take up this call. Following in His footsteps will involve suffering and sacrifice. Yet how can we say no to the King who loves us so completely and promises that His faithful stewards will one day be with Him in Paradise?
