# A Few Words from the Pastor:

THE YEAR OF ST. MATTHEW – Our Sunday gospels come to us in a three-year cycle. The three synoptic gospels, Matthew, Mark and Luke lay out for us the life and ministry of Jesus. This Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent, we begin a new Liturgical year, and this will be the Year of Matthew. Saint Matthew, also known as Levi, was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus and the traditional author of the Gospel according to Matthew. Before being called by Jesus, he worked as a tax collector in Capernaum—an occupation often viewed negatively in Jewish society. After accepting Jesus' invitation, Matthew became a devoted follower and later a key figure in spreading the Christian message. His Gospel, written primarily for a Jewish audience, emphasizes Jesus as the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy and highlights teachings such as the Sermon on the Mount. Christian tradition holds that Matthew preached in regions such as Judea and possibly Ethiopia or Persia.

CHRISTMAS GIFTS FROM THE HOLY LAND – This weekend representatives of the Catholic community of Bethlehem will be here with religious items crafted in the Holy Land. This persecuted community is in great need of our support. Please be generous in your purchases.
