A Few Words from the Pastor:

A BUSY MONTH AHEAD!

January 4 -- Feast of the Epiphany - The **Tomb of the Magi**, also known as the **Shrine of the Three Kings**, is housed in **Cologne Cathedral, Germany**. According to Christian tradition, it contains the relics of the **Three Wise Men** who followed the star to Bethlehem and presented gifts of **gold, frankincense, and myrrh** to the infant Jesus (Matthew 2:1–12). The shrine, dating from the **12th–13th century**, is one of the most important reliquaries in the Christian world. While its authenticity cannot be historically proven, it stands as a powerful symbol of **faith, pilgrimage, and the revelation of Christ to all nations**. *"We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."* (Matthew 2:2)

January 11 – Feast of the Baptism of the Lord - The Baptism of Jesus took place in the River Jordan, where He was baptized by John the Baptist (Matthew 3:13–17). As Jesus came up from the water, the heavens opened, the Holy Spirit descended like a dove, and the voice of the Father declared, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." This sacred event marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and reveals the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It also affirms the call of all Christians to repentance, obedience, and new life through baptism.

January 12 – Martin Luther King Day - Martin Luther King Jr. remains a towering figure in the struggle for civil rights, renowned for his eloquent speeches and unwavering commitment to justice and equality. Central to King's philosophy were numerous biblical passages that profoundly influenced his vision and rhetoric. King's reliance on scripture was not merely rhetorical; it provided moral clarity and strength. His use of specific verses helped articulate a compelling argument for social change grounded in faith-based principles.

January 18 – 25 -- The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The theme of this week of Prayer comes from the Letter to the Ephesians: "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling" (Eph 4:4). The prayers and reflections were prepared by an ecumenical group coordinated by the Armenian Apostolic Church. This Church is one of the oldest Christian communities in the world and the **national church of Armenia**. It belongs to the Oriental Orthodox tradition. Christianity was first preached in Armenia by **Apostles Bartholomew and Thaddeus** in the 1st century. Armenia became the **first nation in the world to adopt Christianity as its state religion in 301 AD**, under **King Tiridates III**, through the evangelization of **Saint Gregory the Illuminator**. This earned Armenia the title of "the first Christian nation."

January 25 -- The Seventh Sunday of the Word of God - will be celebrated on Sunday 25 January 2026, with the motto: "The word of Christ dwells among you" (Col 3:16). The Sunday of the Word of God is a profoundly pastoral initiative to make it clear how important it is in the daily life of the Church and our communities to refer to the Word of God, a Word that is not confined to a book, but which remains ever alive and becomes a concrete and tangible sign. The biblical expression chosen for the celebration of the seventh edition of the *Sunday of the Word of God* is taken from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Colossians: "The word of Christ dwells among you" (3:16).

January 25 – 31 - Catholic Schools Week - an annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States, highlighting the value of faith-based learning, academic excellence, and community service. Its purpose is to celebrate the mission and contributions of Catholic schools, to recognize the work of students, teachers, staff, and families in nurturing faith, character, and academic growth, and to raise awareness of the importance of Catholic education in forming moral and responsible citizens.
