## A Few Words from the Pastor:

**POPE LEO SPEAKS: OLYMPIC PEACE** -- Pope Leo XIV has appealed for respect for the ancient tradition of the Olympic Truce, as the Milano-Cortina Winter Games get underway in northern Italy this week. Speaking at the Angelus last Sunday, the Pope said the Olympics and Paralympics represent an important message of fraternity while rekindling hope for a peaceful world. "This is also the meaning of the Olympic truce, a very ancient custom that accompanies the holding of the Games," he said. The Olympic truce is a tradition dating back to 776 BC in ancient Greece, when states would lay their arms before and during the Games. "I hope that those who care deeply for peace among peoples, and all those in positions of authority, will take this opportunity to make concrete gestures to ease tensions and seek dialogue," said the Pope.

**LENT AT ST. JOHN'S !** The holy season of Lent begins in just ten days! The word "Lent" is an old English word for "Spring." It is thus to be considered a time of joy, as we anticipate the new life which comes with our share in the Resurrection of the Lord.

**WEDNESDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY:** On Wednesday at 6:45 PM in the parish center (following our evening Mass), we gather to reflect on the Sunday readings. Our sessions last about an hour. Please join us!

**ADULT ED IN LENT** – Our Sunday morning sessions will continue through the Lenten Season, as we will complete our discussions of the Creed and turn toward the deeper reflections on the Passion of the Lord.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS** - To encourage greater participation for Stations, and to promote a greater love for the Holy Eucharist, our Friday evening devotions will begin at 5:00 with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, with Stations of the Cross beginning at 5:30. Stations will conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Please consider joining us!

**FASTING AND ABSTINENCE:** Remember that the Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence from meat. Throughout the season of Lent, however, DAILY FASTING can strengthen our will, remind us of the hungers of the human family, and certainly can put us in mind of our hunger for God. Remember that Jesus fasted 40 days and 40 nights in the desert. Our fasting is closely related to our care for the poor: when I fast, another person must eat in my place!

**OPERATION RICE BOWL** - we are participating again this year in Operation Rice Bowl, which is a good companion to our Lenten prayer and fasting. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are the three pillars of the spiritual life.

**SPIRITUAL READING** - An essential part of the Christian life is prayerful reflection. This is especially so within the season of Lent. We will again be making available a booklet of daily meditations for use throughout the Lenten Season. Consider this Lent to be a personal retreat!

**STEWARDSHIP CORNER:** Today's readings are part pep talk and part marching orders for us as Christian stewards. They offer wonderfully clear guidance on what matters most to God in the way we prioritize our lives and the way He intends for us to use the gifts He has given us.

The first reading, from the prophet Isaiah, gives us very straightforward instructions: "Thus says the Lord: Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed, and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own." The Lord gives no wiggle room here – care for our brothers and sisters in need is a "must-do" for the Christian steward. Note, too, that these instructions require action – to share, to shelter, to clothe, and to hang in there with your family members, even the demanding ones.

Our Gospel passage, from Matthew, sends us out on our stewardship way with a bang as Jesus declares to us, His disciples, that we are the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world." But, He adds, salt no longer gives flavor if allowed to go stale, and light cannot bring its blessed brightness if left hidden. Therefore we must act! We must live our lives so that others will see the things that we do – the ways that we serve others, care for the vulnerable, prioritize our family relationships, and, above all, our love for God – and then give Him glory!
